## Assumptions:

The Department of Family Services (DFS) receives approximately \$1.2 million in Child Support Incentive money annually. DFS receives incentives related to five performance measures. One of the performance measures is Arrears Payment performance. If the cases for birthing costs were opened, and placed on the Child Support Program's (CSP) caseload, and the non-custodial parent does not pay the amount of the judgment, the CSP would see a decrease in the Arrears Payment performance measure. An assumption is being made that this decrease in performance could reduce the incentive funds received by \$240,000 a year and that the non-custodial parent does not pay the judgement amount owed.

## NOTICE-AGENCY ESTIMATE OF ADMINISTRATIVE IMPACT REQUESTED

This bill has <u>administrative impact</u> that appears to increase duties or responsibilities of one or more state agencies and may impact agency spending or staffing requirements. As introduced, the bill does not modify any state agency budget or current personnel authorizations.
