Description of Appropriation:

The appropriation will be used to begin steps to set up the administrative structure and processes for a new professional licensing board, Naturopathy Licensing Board.

Assumptions:

The appropriation will be used to cover staffing and support services costs within the Department of Administration and Information's Professional Licensing Board (A&I-PLB) Office. Staffing or 100 Series personnel costs for approximately the last three months of FY 2018 (\$9,801) and into FY 2019 (\$3,543) will be \$13,344. This estimate is based on a half-time BAB010 Business Office Supervisor I position at \$3267 per month (salary and benefits). Support services 200 Series costs include one-time start-up costs for a computer station, telephone, furniture, supplies and travel to board meetings (twice per year, but once in FY 2018).

Source of revenue increase:

The newly created Naturopathy Licensing Board will have authority to set licensing board fees for license holders. Licensing fee levels will be set through the rule-making process once the Board is established and functioning.

Assumptions:

The A&I-PLB Office estimates the revenue increase based on approximately one hundred (100) license holders at a license fee rate of \$500 per licensee, per year. The specified revenue increase also assumes a 10% increase in license holders each year. These estimates are based on review of Colorado and Montana licensed naturopathic practitioners.
