Department of Workforce Services Workers Compensation averages 789 referrals per year so the cost per referral is 6,277.35. (4,952,832/789 = 6,277.35 per referral)

The expenditure decrease to the Industrial Accident Fund is a result of the cost per referral times the average number of appeals which is around \$244,817 per year. (6,277.35 X 39 = 244,816.65)

This assumes the judge denies appeal requests.

The fiscal impact is indeterminable to the judicial system.
