A JOINT RESOLUTION

for

- 1 A JOINT RESOLUTION requesting Congress to enact legislation
- 2 permitting western states to enter into a voluntary compact
- 3 to establish a graduated commercial driver licensing
- 4 program that would allow commercial drivers between
- 5 eighteen (18) and twenty-one (21) years of age to operate a
- 6 commercial motor vehicle in a consenting, contiguous state.

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- 8 WHEREAS, federal law requires drivers to be at least
- 9 twenty-one (21) years of age to operate a commercial motor
- 10 vehicle between states; and

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- 12 WHEREAS, drivers who are between eighteen (18) and twenty-
- 13 one (21) years of age may operate a commercial motor
- 14 vehicle intrastate within the states of Arizona, Colorado,
- 15 Idaho, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, New Mexico, North Dakota,
- 16 Oregon, South Dakota, Utah and Wyoming; and

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- 2 WHEREAS, the trucking industry delivers goods across state
- 3 lines and faces a severe shortage of drivers because of
- 4 increased shipping demand and a high number of retiring
- 5 drivers; and

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- 7 WHEREAS, it is difficult to recruit drivers who are twenty-
- 8 one (21) years of age or older into the trucking industry
- 9 because they have already entered another career path; and

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- 11 WHEREAS, the unemployment rate for persons between eighteen
- 12 (18) and twenty-one (21) years of age is higher than that
- 13 of other age groups; and

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- 15 WHEREAS, the safety performance statistics for non-
- 16 commercial drivers who are between eighteen (18) and
- 17 twenty-one (21) years of age do not necessarily reflect the
- 18 safety performance of the same group who hold a commercial
- 19 driver's license; and

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- 21 WHEREAS, the safety benefits of graduated licensing for
- 22 noncommercial vehicle drivers are well documented and
- 23 similar safety benefits may be possible with a graduated

1 commercial licensing program that expands commercial

2 driving privileges; and

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4 WHEREAS, legislation allowing a voluntary compact between

5 Arizona, Colorado, Idaho, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, New

6 Mexico, North Dakota, Oregon, South Dakota, Utah and

7 Wyoming could include a conditional lowering of the twenty-

8 one (21) year old commercial driver age requirement and

9 would allow these contiguous states to establish a

10 graduated commercial driver licensing program to allow

11 drivers between eighteen (18) and twenty-one (21) years of

12 age to operate a commercial motor vehicle in a consenting,

13 contiguous state.

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15 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MEMBERS OF THE

16 LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WYOMING:

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18 **Section 1.** That Congress enact legislation permitting

19 Arizona, Colorado, Idaho, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, New

20 Mexico, North Dakota, Oregon, South Dakota, Utah and

21 Wyoming to enter into a voluntary compact to establish a

22 graduated commercial driver licensing program to allow

23 drivers who are between eighteen (18) and twenty-one (21)

1 years of age and who hold a commercial driver's license

2 issued by a compact state to operate a commercial motor

3 vehicle in a consenting, contiguous compact state.

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5 Section 2. That the Secretary of State of Wyoming

6 transmit copies of this resolution to the President and the

7 Majority Leader of the Senate and the Speaker of the House

8 of Representatives of the United States Congress, the

9 Wyoming Congressional Delegation and to the congressional

10 delegations and the legislative bodies of Arizona,

11 Colorado, Idaho, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, New Mexico,

12 North Dakota, Oregon, South Dakota and Utah.
