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Page 97-after line 3 Insert the following new section and renumber as necessary:

"[REVIEW OF PSYCHIATRIC AND COORDINATION SERVICES FOR CHILDREN]

Section 345.

(a) The department of education, the department of family services and the department of health shall jointly study the needs of children who receive psychiatric care at public or private facilities. The study shall focus on follow-up and step-down care that would benefit children discharged from formal care settings and shall include identification of:

(i) The types of conditions that would most benefit from follow-up or step-down care and the systems or means that could be employed to identify children with these conditions;

(ii) The types and appropriate length of follow-up or step-down care that would most benefit children recently discharged from mandatory care settings while balancing the cost of providing continuing follow-up or step-down care;

(iii) Currently available follow-up or step-down care in Wyoming, barriers that exist to the delivery of effective follow-up or step-down care in Wyoming and the capacity of state and local government agencies and private parties to provide the types of follow-up or step-down services that would be most beneficial;

 (iv) The costs of providing effective follow-up or step-down care by state or local government agencies, through private parties or through a combination of agencies and private parties.

(b) The study required by subsection (a) of this section shall also focus on coordination services that are designed to

provide an appropriate transition of children into follow-up or step-down care and that monitor the delivery of follow-up and step-down care. This portion of the study shall include consideration of:

(i) The types and appropriate length of coordination services that would be most beneficial to children transitioning to or receiving follow-up or step-down care while balancing the cost of providing continuing coordination services;

(ii) The current availability of coordination services and the state or local agencies, or private third parties, that provide coordination services, any barriers that currently exist to providing effective coordination services in Wyoming and the capacity of state and local government agencies, or the availability of private third parties, to provide coordination services;

(iii) The costs of providing effective coordination services by state or local agencies, through private parties or through a combination of agencies and private parties.

 (c) The department of education, the department of family services and the department of health shall jointly report the results of the study required by this section to the joint labor, health and social services interim committee not later than August 1, 2019. The report shall include recommendations to address the findings of the study.

(d) This section shall be effective only if 2018 House Bill 0249 is not enacted into law.".
