An applicant with an associate degree shall complete not less than four thousand (4,000) hours of supervised clinical experience before becoming eligible to apply for certification under this subsection;

(v) The applicant has demonstrated knowledge in the field of addictions treatment in general by passing a standard examination which may be written or situational, as the board prescribes. The board may develop, adopt and administer appropriate examinations and is comprised of either the examination offered by the national association for alcohol and drug abuse counselors or the international certification and reciprocity consortium. The board shall accept the results of either examination. The board shall establish specific provisions for examination of applicants for certification in the specific discipline at reasonable times and places at least twice each year;".

"(r) In addition to other provisions establishing licensing without examination under this section, the board shall grant certification without examination as a licensed addictions therapist or certified addictions practitioner if:

(i) The person, at the time of application, maintains a license in good standing to practice in another state and has been licensed in that state for not less than two (2) years as a licensed addictions therapist or certified addictions practitioner, or any other role, however designated, with a scope of practice substantially similar to a licensed addictions therapist or certified addictions practitioner. As used in this paragraph, "substantially similar" means having a preponderance of characteristics in common and does not mean that the scope of practice of the person in the licensed state is required to be identical to the scope of practice for licensed addictions therapists or certified addictions practitioners in Wyoming;

 (ii) The applicant has no felony convictions and no misdemeanor convictions that relate adversely to the practice of addictions therapy, provided that exemptions to this requirement may be granted by the board if consistent with the public interest; and

(iii) Upon payment of a fee established by the board.

(s) The provisions of subsection (r) of this section shall be an additional means of licensure for licensed addictions therapists and certified addictions practitioners. The board shall not impose other requirements for licensure under subsection (r) of this section.".
