(s) Certification under this subsection shall allow limited practice of addictions therapy as a certified criminal justice professional-applicant only under the supervision of a qualified clinical supervisor within the criminal justice system, which shall include the Wyoming court system, probation and parole services and prisons. Certification under this section shall expire five (5) years after issuance, but may be renewed. An applicant shall work toward the certification set forth in subsection (r) of this section. The board shall grant certification as a certified criminal justice professional-applicant under this subsection to any applicant who files an application upon a form and in the manner prescribed by the board, accompanied by an appropriate fee and who furnishes satisfactory evidence to the board of the following:

(i) The applicant has reached the age of majority;

(ii) The applicant has no felony convictions and no misdemeanor convictions that relate adversely to the practice of addictions therapy or to the ability to practice addictions therapy, although exceptions to this requirement may be granted by the board if consistent with the public interest;

 (iii) The applicant has obtained an associate's degree in criminal justice or a related field and has obtained not less than two hundred seventy (270) clock hours of education in addictions specific subjects.

 (t) The provisions of subsections (r) and (s) of this section are additional means of certification under this section and are self-contained certifications. The board shall not impose additional qualifications for licensure or scope of practice beyond those specified by subsections (r) and (s) of this section.

(u) In addition to other provisions establishing licensing without examination under this section, the board shall grant certification without examination as a licensed addictions therapist, certified addictions practitioner, certified criminal justice professional or certified criminal justice addictions professional-applicant if:

(i) The person, at the time of application, maintains a license or certification in good standing to practice in another state and has been licensed or certified in that state for not

less than two (2) years with a scope of practice substantially similar to a licensed addictions therapist, certified addictions practitioner, certified criminal justice professional or certified criminal justice addictions professional-applicant. As used in this paragraph, "substantially similar" means having a preponderance of characteristics in common and shall not mean that the scope of practice of the person in the licensed state is required to be identical or overwhelmingly similar to the scope of practice established by this section. The board shall not impose further qualifications for licensure under this subsection;

(ii) The applicant has no felony convictions and no misdemeanor convictions that relate adversely to the practice of addictions therapy, provided that exemptions to this requirement may be granted by the board if consistent with the public interest; and

(iii) Upon payment of a fee established by the board.".

"Section 3. The mental health professions licensing board shall adopt rules to implement this act on or before October 1, 2019.

Section 4. The mental health professions licensing board shall issue a report to the joint labor, health and social services interim committee on all actions taken pursuant to this act, which shall include the adoption of rules, on or before October 1, 2019.".
