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3 "(d) Any physician, physician's assistant or nurse  
4 practitioner examining a child and finding reasonable cause to  
5 believe the child is a victim of child abuse or neglect and having  
6 reasonable cause to believe that other children residing in the  
7 same home may also be a victim of child abuse or neglect shall  
8 report to law enforcement the results of the examination and facts  
9 supporting reasonable cause with respect to the other child or  
10 children. Law enforcement may then bring any other child residing  
11 in the same home to a physician, physician's assistant or nurse  
12 practitioner for examination. The examination shall take place  
13 within twenty-four (24) hours. Any physician, physician's  
14 assistant, nurse practitioner or law enforcement officer denied  
15 access to a child for the purposes of examination under this  
16 subsection may seek an appropriate court order by ex parte  
17 proceedings or other appropriate proceedings to provide for the  
18 examination. After receiving the timely results of the examination  
19 the examining physician, physician's assistant, nurse  
20 practitioner, law enforcement officer or local child protective  
21 agency shall consider whether temporary protective custody is
