## A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to the Wyoming lottery; clarifying the 2 calculation and disposition of expenses and proceeds of the

3 lottery; revising terminology; specifying benefits for

4 employees of the lottery; specifying requirements for

5 procurement contracts; specifying use of the fidelity fund;

6 revising requirements related to unclaimed prize money;

7 making conforming changes; specifying applicability; and

8 providing for an effective date.

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10 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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12 **Section** 1. W.S. 9-17-103(a)(vii) and (ix),

9-17-108(a)(i), 9-17-110 by creating a new subsection (h),

14 9-17-111(a) and (b)(intro), 9-17-113(d), 9-17-116(a),

9-17-119(g), 9-17-120(a) and 9-17-128(a)(i) are amended to

2	9-17-103. Definitions.
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4	(a) As used in this chapter:
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6	(vii) "Major procurement contract" means any
7	gaming product or service costing in excess of seventy-five
8	thousand dollars (\$75,000.00) in a fiscal year including, but
9	not limited to, major advertising contracts, annuity
10	contracts, prize payment agreements, consulting services,
11	equipment, tickets and other products and services unique to
12	the Wyoming lottery, but not including materials, supplies,
13	equipment and services common to the ordinary operation of a
14	corporate entity;
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16	(ix) "Net proceeds" means all revenue derived from
17	the sale of lottery tickets or shares and all other monies
18	derived from the lottery less operating expenses less direct,
19	indirect, operating and nonoperating expenses consistent with
20	generally accepted accounting principles;
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22	9-17-108. Adoption by board of procedures regulating
23	conduct of lottery games.

1 2 (a) The board may adopt regulations, policies and 3 procedures regulating the conduct of lottery games 4 general, including, but not limited to, regulations, policies 5 and procedures specifying: 6 7 (i) The type of games to be conducted, specifically limited to a state lottery or a multi-state 8 9 lottery, and shall not include instant lotteries instant-win 10 tickets, scratch-off ticket games, video lottery terminals or 11 any other electronic game involving direct physical contact 12 between the player and a machine; 13 14 9-17-110. Employees; compensation; restrictions; 15 background investigations; bonding. 16 17 (h) Employees of the corporation shall be covered by 18 the Wyoming Retirement Act. 19 20 9-17-111. Disposition of lottery proceeds. 21 (a) As nearly as practical, at least forty-five percent 22 (45%) of the net proceeds total revenue from the sale of 23

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1 lottery tickets or shares shall be made available as prize

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2 money, provided, however, that this subsection shall be

3 deemed not to create any lien, entitlement, cause of action

4 or other private right and any rights of holders of tickets

5 or shares shall be determined by the corporation in setting

6 the terms of its lottery or lotteries.

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8 (b) On or before the fifteenth day of each quarter, the corporation shall transfer to the treasurer's office, for 9 10 credit to the lottery account which is hereby created, the 11 amount of all at least seventy-five percent (75%) of the net 12 proceeds minus prizes and amounts earned pursuant to subsection (a) of this section during from the preceding 13 14 quarter. Final reconciliation of the transfer to the state under this subsection shall be determined at the end of each 15 16 fiscal year based on the audited annual financial statements. Upon their deposit into the account, any monies representing 17 a deposit of net proceeds shall then become the unencumbered 18 19 property of the state of Wyoming and the corporation shall 20 have no power to agree or undertake otherwise. At least once 21 per fiscal year, these monies shall be paid by the treasurer to the treasurers of the counties, cities and towns for 22 23 payment into their respective general funds. The percentage

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1 of the balance that will be distributed to each county and 2 its cities and towns will be determined by computing the 3 percentage that sales of lottery tickets collected by 4 retailers in each county including its cities and towns bear to total sales of lottery tickets collected by retailers in 5 all counties including their cities and towns. 6 percentage of the monies shall be distributed within each 7 8 county as follows: 9 10 9-17-113. Bonding requirements for vendors; qualifications of vendors; competitive bid requirement. 11 12 major procurement contracts 13 (d) All shall competitively bid pursuant to policies and procedures 14 approved by the board unless: 15 16 17 (i) There is only one (1) qualified vendor and that vendor has an exclusive right to offer the service or 18 19 product: or 20

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(ii) The major procurement contract is an

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amendment, extension or renewal of an existing contract with

1 terms that are not materially different than the terms of the

2 <u>existing contract.</u>

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4 9-17-116. Fidelity fund for retailers; assessments.

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The corporation may establish a fidelity fund 6 separate from all other funds and shall assess each retailer 7 8 a one (1) time fee not to exceed one hundred dollars (\$100.00) per sales location. The corporation is authorized to invest 9 10 the funds or place the funds in one (1) or more interest 11 bearing accounts. Monies deposited to the fund may be used 12 losses the corporation experiences cover nonfeasance, misfeasance or malfeasance of a 13 retailer. In addition, the funds may be used to purchase 14 15 blanket bonds covering the Wyoming lottery corporation 16 against losses from all retailers. At the end of each fiscal 17 year, the corporation shall pay to the general lottery fund any amount in the fidelity fund which exceeds five hundred 18 thousand dollars (\$500,000.00) two hundred fifty thousand 19 20 dollars (\$250,000.00) and the funds shall be commingled with 21 and treated as net proceeds from the lottery.

- 9-17-119. Prize proceeds subject to attachments,
- 2 garnishments or executions; validation of winning tickets;

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- 6 (g) Unclaimed prize money shall not constitute net
- 7 proceeds be used to offset prize expenses. A portion of
- 8 unclaimed prize money, not to exceed two hundred thousand
- 9 dollars (\$200,000.00) annually, shall be used by the
- 10 corporation to develop, in consultation with the department
- 11 of health programs for the treatment of compulsive gambling
- 12 disorder and educational programs related to the disorder.
- 13 In addition, unclaimed prize money may be added to the pool
- 14 from which future prizes are to be awarded or used for special
- 15 prize promotions.

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- 17 9-17-120. Confidentiality of information;
- 18 investigations; supervision and inspections; reports of
- 19 suspected violations; assistance in investigation of
- 20 violations.

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- 22 (a) Except as authorized in this chapter, the
- 23 corporation is subject to the provisions of W.S. 16-4-201

1 through 16-4-205 and 16-4-401 through 16-4-408. The 2 corporation is specifically authorized to determine which 3 information relating to the operation of the lottery is 4 confidential. Confidential information includes trade 5 secrets, security measures, systems or procedures, security reports, information concerning bids or other contractual 6 data, the disclosure of which would impair the efforts of the 7 corporation to contract for goods or services on favorable 8 9 employee personnel information unrelated 10 compensation, duties, qualifications or responsibilities and 11 information obtained pursuant to investigations which is 12 otherwise confidential. Information deemed confidential 13 pursuant to this subsection is exempt from the provisions of W.S. 16-4-201 through 16-4-205. Meetings or portions of 14 15 devoted to discussing information meetings deemed 16 confidential pursuant to this subsection are exempt from W.S.

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22 (a) To ensure the financial integrity of the lottery,

23 the corporation through its board of directors shall:

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2 (i) Submit quarterly and annual reports to the 3 governor, department of audit, the joint revenue interim 4 committee and the joint travel, recreation, wildlife and 5 cultural resources interim committee disclosing the total 6 lottery revenues, prize disbursements, operating expenses and administrative expenses of the corporation during the 7 8 reporting period. The annual report shall additionally 9 describe the organizational structure of the corporation and 10 summarize the functions performed by each organizational 11 division within the corporation;

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13 **Section 2.** W.S. 9-17-103(a)(i) and (x) is repealed.

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Section 3. The benefits specified for employees of the lottery corporation as provided in W.S. 9-17-110(h) created in section 1 of this act shall be effective beginning on the effective date of this act.

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20 **Section 4.** The change in the accounting of revenue and 21 proceeds of the lottery under sections 1 and 2 of this act 22 shall be reflected through reclassification journal entries

on the balance sheet of the lottery corporation effective on the effective date of this act.

Section 5. This act is effective July 1, 2019.
