A BILL

ARTICLE 6
DO NOT RESUSCITATE DIRECTIVES AND IDENTIFICATION
35-22-601. Definitions.
(a) As used in this article:
(i) "Cardiopulmonary resuscitation" means
measures to restore cardiac function or to support breathing
in the event of respiratory or cardiac arrest or malfunction.
"Cardiopulmonary resuscitation" includes, but is not limited
to, chest compression, delivering electric shock to the chest
or other manual or mechanical methods to assist breathing;
or other mandar or medianious mediads to assist sreading,

directive signed by a person and a health care provider that

cardiopulmonary resuscitation should not be administered to

1 2 (iii) "Do not resuscitate identification" means a 3 standardized identification bracelet, physician order or 4 designation on a Wyoming driver's license or identification 5 card; 6 7 (iv) "Emergency medical service personnel" means any emergency medical technician at any level who is certified 8 by the department of health. "Emergency medical service 9 10 personnel" includes a first responder certified by the 11 department of health; 12 (v) "Health care provider" means as defined in 13 W.S. 1-1-130(b)(i); 14 15 16 (vi) "Law enforcement officer" means as defined in 17 W.S. 35-7-1002(a)(xxiv); 18 19 (vii) "Trauma" means blunt or penetrating bodily 20 injuries from impacts that occur in situations including, but not limited to, motor vehicle collisions, mass casualty 21 incidents and industrial accidents. 22

Do not resuscitate directive; who 2 execute; presumption. 3 4 (a) Any adult who has the capacity to provide informed consent to, or refusal of, medical treatment may complete a 5 do not resuscitate directive as provided in this article for 6 the purpose of seeking a do not resuscitate designation under 7 8 W.S. 31-7-142 or to wear a do not resuscitate bracelet as 9 provided in W.S. 35-22-605(a)(iii). 10 11 (b) In the absence of a do not resuscitate directive, 12 a person's consent to cardiopulmonary resuscitation in the event of trauma and where other directives are not known and 13 14 available shall be presumed. 15 16 35-22-603. Do not resuscitate directive; applicability; liability of emergency medical service and law 17 enforcement officers. 18

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20 (a) For purposes of direction to emergency medical 21 service personnel and law enforcement officers, a do not 22 resuscitate directive shall not apply to treatment rendered 23 at the site where trauma has occurred to a person who

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1 experiences cardiac or respiratory arrest as the result of

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4 (b) Health care providers and health care facilities

5 shall comply with a do not resuscitate directive that is

6 apparent and immediately available and that does not conflict

7 with any other directive that is apparent and immediately

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10 (c) Any emergency medical service personnel, law

12 facility or any other person who, in good faith, complies

13 with a do not resuscitate directive that is reasonably

14 perceived to be valid shall not be subject to civil or

15 criminal liability or regulatory sanction for compliance.
