Hathaway provisional opportunity 18 scholarships. 19 20 (a) Any student who meets the criteria under W.S. 21 21-16-1303 is eligible to receive a Hathaway provisional opportunity scholarship to pursue a certificate or degree as 22 follows: 23

2 (iii) A student who receives a scholarship under 3 paragraph (i) of this subsection and who earns a certificate 4 from the community college with a minimum cumulative GPA of 5 2.25 may extend the provisional opportunity scholarship to 6 pursue either a certificate or a degree at a Wyoming community college or if the student earns a degree from the community 7 8 college with a minimum GPA of 2.25, may extend the scholarship 9 to pursue a degree at the University of Wyoming if the student 10 maintains a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.25 and otherwise remains eligible for a scholarship under this article. A 11 12 student who receives a scholarship under paragraph (i) of 13 this subsection, is enrolled in a community college applied baccalaureate program and has received a minimum cumulative 14 GPA of 2.25 after four (4) full-time semesters may extend the 15 16 provisional opportunity scholarship for an additional four (4) full-time semesters to complete the baccalaureate degree 17 if the student maintains a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.25 and 18 19 otherwise remains eligible for a scholarship under this 20 article. The scholarship under this paragraph shall be for 21 the same amounts and subject to the same limitations as 22 provided for scholarships under paragraph (a)(i) of this 23 section, except that the student may continue a baccalaureate
