Source of revenue increase: The Board of Medicine would receive revenue from anesthesiology assistant license application and annual renewal fees.

Assumptions: The estimates provided in the table above are based on the following assumptions:

- There will be 12 applications in the first year and 8 per year thereafter
- 90% of license holders will seek renewal each year
- The application fee was estimated at \$250
- The annual license renewal fee was estimated at \$100
- FY 2021: 12 new applicants x \$250 application fee = \$3,000
10 renewals x \$100 renewal fee = \$1,000
- FY 2022: 8 new applicants x \$250 application fee = \$2,000
8 renewals x \$100 renewal fee = \$800
- FY 2023: 8 new applications x \$250 application fee = \$2,000
15 renewals x \$100 renewal fee = \$1,500
