1	AN ACT relating to concealed weapons permits; providing for
2	renewal of concealed weapons permits for military personnel
3	and spouses under specified conditions; providing an
4	extension renewal period for deployed armed force members
5	under specified circumstances; and providing for an
6	effective date.

8	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

2 (s) The permittee may renew his permit on or before 3 the expiration date by filing with the sheriff of the 4 applicant's county of residence the renewal form, a 5 notarized affidavit stating that the permittee remains qualified pursuant to the criteria specified in this 6 section, and the required renewal fee. The permit shall be 7 8 renewed to a qualified applicant upon receipt of the completed renewal application, appropriate payment of fees 9 10 and the division shall verify that the criminal history 11 information available to the division does not indicate 12 that possession of a firearm by the applicant would constitute a violation of state or federal law. A permittee 13 who fails to file a renewal application on or before its 14 expiration date shall renew his permit by paying a late fee 15 16 of ten dollars (\$10.00), but no late fee shall be charged 17 for permits renewed by deployed armed force members through the additional renewal period under subsection (cc) of this 18 19 section. Subject to subsection (cc) of this section, no 20 permit shall be renewed six (6) months or more after its 21 expiration date, and the permit shall be deemed to be 22 permanently expired. A person whose permit has permanently

expired may reapply for a permit pursuant to subsections
(b) through (e) of this section.

4 (CC) The attorney general shall by rule and 5 regulation provide a procedure under which a person who is in active military service outside the state of Wyoming, or 6 who is a military spouse as defined by rule of the attorney 7 8 general residing with a person in active military service 9 outside the state, but otherwise meets the requirements 10 specified in subsection (b) of this section may apply for a 11 permit or a renewal of a permit to carry a concealed 12 firearm under this section without appearing in Wyoming. An application for a permit or renewal under this 13 subsection shall be filed with the division of criminal 14 investigation and accepted during active military service 15 16 outside the state. Members of the armed forces who are 17 deployed outside the United States and whose permit expire during their term of deployment shall be permitted to renew 18 19 their permits through the deployment period and not later 20 than six (6) months after returning to the United States after deployment. An expired permit which is not renewed 21 prior to the end of the extended period provided in this 22 subsection shall be deemed to be permanently expired as 23

2	provided in this subsection, requirements for applications
3	for all renewals under this subsection shall be the same as
4	those required for non-late renewals under subsection (s)
5	of this section, together with verification of active
6	military status, deployment outside the United States,
7	termination of deployment outside the United States and
8	marital status, all as applicable and as required by rule
9	of the attorney general. Applications, other than renewals,
10	under this subsection shall require:

13 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 14 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming 15 Constitution.
