A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to public lands; requiring a study to

2 evaluate federal payments in lieu of taxes and to appraise

3 the value of federally held lands in Wyoming; authorizing

4 the use of consultants; requiring reports; defining terms;

5 providing an appropriation; and providing for an effective

6 date.

8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

9

10 Section 1.

11

12 (a) As used in this section:

13

1 (i) "Federal land" means any land within the 2 state of Wyoming that is owned, held or controlled by the 3 United States government or any agency, department or 4 subdivision thereof. "Federal land" shall not include: 5 (A) Any federal military installation; 6 7 8 (B) Any federal enclave created under article I, section 8, clause 17 of the United States 9 10 Constitution; 11 12 (C) Land within the limits of any Indian reservation as provided in 18 U.S.C. § 1151. 13 14 (ii) "Payments in lieu of tax" means payments 15 16 made by the United States government to the state of 17 Wyoming or a county, municipality or school district in Wyoming. "Payments in lieu of tax" shall include: 18 19 20 (A) Payments for entitlement land as provided in 31 U.S.C. §§ 6901 through 6907; 21 22

1 (B) Impact aid payments as provided in 20

2 U.S.C. §§ 7701 through 7714.

3

4 (b) Not later than November 1, 2021, the office of

5 state lands and investments shall study the impact on the

6 failure of the United States government to make payments in

7 lieu of tax that are equivalent to the property tax revenue

8 that the state of Wyoming would otherwise generate from

9 lands under federal ownership or control within Wyoming.

10 The office shall evaluate and appraise all federal lands in

11 Wyoming in real time to determine the fair taxable value of

12 all federal lands in Wyoming.

13

14 (c) The office of state lands and investments shall

15 work with professional consultant experts to complete the

16 study required under this section. The office shall retain

17 professional consulting experts for the purposes of this

18 act.

20 (d) As part of the study required under this section,

21 the office of state lands and investments shall:

1 (i) Hold at least one (1) public meeting to

2 accept testimony from representatives of each United States

3 senator and representative elected from Wyoming, any state

4 agency, county, municipality, political subdivision and

5 school district and any other interested party impacted by

6 the United States government's failure to make payments in

7 lieu of tax that are equivalent to the property tax revenue

8 that federal lands would generate;

9

10 (ii) Compile data necessary to conduct the real-time appraisal required under subsection (b) of this 11 section. The office of state lands and investments shall 12 13 collect, provide and update information and data as requested by professional consultant experts working with 14 15 the office. Other state agencies and counties shall prepare, collect, provide and update information and data 16 17 as requested by the office of state lands and investments and professional consultant experts working with the 18

office.

(e) For the period beginning with the effective date of this act and ending November 1, 2021, the office of state lands and investments shall report quarterly to the

- 1 joint agriculture, state and public lands and water
- 2 resources interim committee on the progress of the study
- 3 required by this section. The first quarterly report shall
- 4 be submitted not later than June 30, 2020. Each subsequent
- 5 quarterly report shall be submitted to the committee not
- 6 later than the final calendar day of each calendar quarter.
- 7 The office shall submit a final report to the joint
- 8 agriculture, state and public lands and water resources
- 9 interim committee not later than November 1, 2021 on the
- 10 results of the study required by this section.

- 12 (f) The joint agriculture, state and public lands and
- 13 water resources interim committee may coordinate with each
- 14 United States senator or representative elected from
- 15 Wyoming to secure payments in lieu of tax that are
- 16 equivalent to the property tax revenue that the state would
- 17 otherwise generate from lands under federal ownership or
- 18 control within Wyoming.

- 20 (g) The joint agriculture, state and public lands and
- 21 water resources interim committee may sponsor any
- 22 legislation necessary to complete the study required by
- 23 this section. The committee may sponsor any legislation in

1 response to the results of the study required by this

2 section.

3

4 (h) Notwithstanding W.S. 9-2-1008, 9-2-1012(e) and 9-4-207, five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000.00) of the 5 unexpended, unobligated monies appropriated 6 from legislative stabilization reserve account to the office of 7 8 the governor under 2018 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter 134, 9 Section 331(h) shall revert and is appropriated to the 10 office of state lands and investments for expenses 11 associated with any consulting services procured by the 12 office as provided by this act. This appropriation shall be for the period beginning with the effective date of this 13 act and ending June 30, 2022. This appropriation shall not 14 be transferred or expended for any other purpose and any 15 16 unexpended, unobligated funds remaining from 17 appropriation shall revert as provided by law on June 30, intent of the legislature that this 18 2022. It is the 19 appropriation not be included in the office's standard

22 (j) Notwithstanding W.S. 9-2-1008, 9-2-1012(e) and 23 9-4-207, two million dollars (\$2,000,000.00) of the

budget for the immediately succeeding fiscal biennium.

1 unexpended, unobligated monies appropriated from the 2 legislative stabilization reserve account to the office of 3 the governor under 2018 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter 134, 4 Section 331(h) shall revert and is appropriated to the 5 office of state lands and investments for expenses associated with any licensing or subscription fees for 6 software associated with the appraisals conducted pursuant 7 8 to this act. Of this appropriation, not more than four 9 hundred thousand dollars (\$400,000.00) shall be expended in 10 any one (1) fiscal year. This appropriation shall be for 11 the period beginning with the effective date of this act and ending June 30, 2026. This appropriation shall not be 12 13 transferred or expended for any other purpose and any unexpended, unobligated funds 14 remaining from this appropriation shall revert as provided by law on June 30, 15 16 Ιt is the intent of the legislature that this 17 appropriation not be included in the office's standard 18 budget for the immediately succeeding fiscal biennium.

1 Section 2. This act is effective immediately upon

2 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

3 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

4 Constitution.
