## A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to civil procedure; providing immunity from

2 civil liability for damages and injuries resulting from

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7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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9 **Section 1**. W.S. 1-1-139 is created to read:

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11 1-1-139. Immunity from civil liability for

12 coronavirus exposure or illness.

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14 (a) As used in this section:

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1 (i) "Business entity" means a corporation, 2 association, partnership, trust, joint venture, limited 3 liability company, limited liability partnership or other 4 legal business entity and shall include both for profit and nonprofit entities. For purposes of this section, "business 5 entity" shall include employees and agents of the business 6 entity while the employee or agent is acting within the 7 8 scope of his employment; 9 10 (ii) "Coronavirus" means: 11 12 Severe acute respiratory syndrome (A) coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2) or the disease caused by severe 13 14 acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2; 15 16 (B) Any coronavirus that results in a 17 pandemic. 18 (b) Except as provided in subsection (c) of this 19 20 section, a property owner, property lessee, property user 21 or a business entity is immune from civil liability for any action or omission that resulted in alleged exposure to or 22 23 the contracting of coronavirus on the property or premises

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1 of the property owner, property lessee, property user or

2 business entity.

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4 (c) This section shall not grant immunity to any

5 property owner, property lessee, property user or business

6 entity if the injury from actual or perceived exposure to

7 or the contracting of coronavirus resulted from an

8 intentional action of exposing an individual to

9 coronavirus.

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11 Section 2. This act shall apply to actions and

12 omissions and injuries from actual or perceived exposure to

13 coronavirus that occur on or after the effective date of

14 this act.

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16 **Section 3**. This act is effective immediately upon

17 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

18 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

19 Constitution.
