

FISCAL NOTE

The Secretary of State's Office will experience an estimated expenditure increase of approximately \$122,000 for this resolution in FY23 for statutory publication costs. This estimate is based on anticipated publication costs for resolutions of this type of \$16,000 for introductory lines plus \$2,000 for each line of text in the proposed resolution and proposed ballot language.

This constitutional amendment would transfer the primary responsibility to provide school facilities to school districts, and would require mandatory state aid to bring amounts raised by local taxes up to what a statewide levy would raise on a per person basis. This constitutional amendment would also authorize the legislature to appropriate additional funds to relieve undue hardships.

The fiscal impact of this constitutional amendment is indeterminable, as it would be contingent on 1) the passage of the constitutional amendment by the electors of the state of Wyoming in the 2022 General Election and 2) the passage of future legislation by the Wyoming Legislature.
