(d) The division shall send a notification for an 13 identification card to the last known address of every 14 eligible registrant, or notify by electronic means if the 15 16 eligible registrant has consented to receive notices electronically, within one hundred twenty (120) days prior 17 to expiration of the registrant's identification card. The 18 19 notification shall conspicuously advise registrants of the 20 requirement that in person voters present acceptable 21 identification immediately before voting at the polling place or absentee polling place and that an identification 22 card is a form of acceptable identification. 23
