1 AN ACT relating to professions and occupations; amending 2 dentists and dental hygienists licensing statutes to

3 include denturists; increasing the number of board members

4 as specified; amending requirements relating to permissible

5 supervised work by specified persons; amending other laws

6 relating to dentists and dental hygienists to include

7 denturists as specified; and providing for an effective

8 date.

The board shall consist 4 of six (6) seven (7) members appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of the state senate. 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8 Any dentist authorized to practice dentistry within the 9 state may employ dental hygienists and denturists who shall 10 be examined and possess the qualifications provided in this act. A dental hygienist and denturist may perform any 11 12 services for a patient which are consistent with what the 13 dental hygienists and denturists are trained to do in accredited dental hygiene or denturitry schools accredited 14 by the commission on dental accreditation of the American 15 16 Dental Association, the National Denturist Association or 17 other board approved education program. Hygienists and denturists shall not perform any other operation on the 18 19 teeth or mouth and shall be regulated by the rules and 20 regulations promulgated by the board. The above services 21 shall be performed under the supervision of a licensed dentist. Dental hygienists and denturists shall practice in 22 the office of any licensed dentist, or in any public or 23

1 private institution under the supervision of a licensed

2 dentist. The board may revoke or suspend the license of any

3 dentist who permits any dental hygienist or denturist

4 operating under his supervision to perform any operations

5 or functions other than those permitted under this act.

The renewal certificate shall 5 be made available to the supervising dentist. Any license 6 granted by the board shall be cancelled after ten (10) days 7 8 notice by registered mail if the holder fails to secure the renewal certificate within three (3) months after December 9 10 31 each year. Any license cancelled may be restored by the 11 board upon payment of a fee set by the board, if paid by 12 December 31 of the year the license was cancelled. 14

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(d) Any dental hygienist or denturist whose application for renewal indicates that the hygienist or 15 16 denturist has not actively practiced or engaged in teaching 17 dental hygiene or engaged in teaching dental hygiene or 18 denturitry for the preceding five (5) years shall be issued 19 a renewal certificate only after demonstrating to the board 20 the hygienist <u>or denturist</u> has maintained the qualifications set forth in this act. The board may require 21 reexamination if it finds good cause to believe that the 22

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1 (a) As used in this act: 2 3 (ii) "Dentistry" means the healing art practiced 4 by a dentist, dental hygienist or a denturist which is concerned with the examination, diagnosis, treatment, 5 planning and care of conditions within the human oral 6 cavity and its adjacent tissues and structures; 7 8 9 (xii) "Proprietor" includes any person who: 10 11 (A) Employs dentists, dental hygienists, 12 denturists or dental auxiliaries in the operation of a dental office, except as defined in this act; or 13 14 15 (B) Places in the possession of a dentist, 16 dental hygienist, denturist, or dental auxiliary or any 17 other agent such dental material or equipment as may be necessary for the management of a dental office on the 18 19 basis of a lease or any other agreement for compensation 20 for the use of such material, equipment or offices; or 21 (C) Retains the ownership or control of 22 dental equipment or material or office and makes the same 23

The 21 holder shall not accept any form of remuneration for 22 providing dental, or dental hygiene or denturitry services while in possession of the certificate. The board may 23

2 satisfactory to the board that the holder has engaged in

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(g) To be eligible for renewal of a volunteer's 6 certificate, the holder of the certificate shall certify to 7 8 the board completion of any continuing education required under this act as if the holder of the certificate were in 9 10 active practice. The board shall not renew a certificate if 11 the holder has not complied with the continuing education 12 requirements. The nonprofit health care facility in which 13 the holder provides dental, or dental hygiene or denturitry services may pay for or reimburse the holder for any costs 14

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(h) The board shall issue to each person who qualifies under this section a volunteer's certificate that states the certificate holder is authorized to provide dental, or dental hygiene or denturitry services pursuant to the laws of this state.

Medical digital innovation sandbox waiver; applicability of criminal statutes; referrals; 18 19 liability. 20 21 (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a

person who makes an innovative medical digital assessment

product or service available to consumers in the medical

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1 digital innovation sandbox may be granted a waiver from 2 specified requirements imposed by statute or rule, or portions thereof, if these statutes or rules do not 3 4 currently permit the product or service to be made available to consumers.
