- 10 35-1-305. Appointment of health officers and other
- 11 personnel generally; local board of health may fix fees for
- 12 certain services.

- 14 (a) In the counties, municipalities or districts
- 15 where health departments are created, as provided herein,

the local board of health may appoint a full_time or part_ 1 2 time health officer, deputy health officers, public health 3 nurses, sanitarians, environmental health specialists and 4 such other public health personnel as may be deemed necessary to adequately protect the public health. Any 5 6 full-time or part-time health officer shall have a degree of doctor of medicine or be an advanced practice registered 7 8 nurse as defined in W.S. 33-21-120(a)(i) and shall assist the state department of health in carrying out the 9 10 provisions of all health and sanitary laws and regulations of the state. Subject to subsection (c) of this section, 11 12 the local board of health may fix reasonable fees and 13 charges for services, except for follow-up of communicable diseases and for individuals who receive services under the 14 15 public health nursing infant home visitation subprogram 16 created by W.S. 35-27-102. No person shall be denied 17 necessary nursing services within the limits of available personnel because of an inability to pay the cost of such 18 19 services.

8	where such departments are not established may form a
9	health district and appoint a district health officer
10	thereof. The term of office for the county, $municipal_7$ or
11	district health officer shall be four (4) years unless
12	sooner removed by the board of county commissioners,
13	municipal, or district governing body. He The county,
14	municipal or district health officer shall have a degree of
15	doctor of medicine or be an advanced practice registered
16	nurse as defined in W.S. 33-21-120(a)(i), and shall assist
17	the state department of health in carrying out the

Section 2. This act applies to persons appointed as county, municipal or district health officers on and after July 1, 2021.
