1 AN ACT relating to the public health; amending and creating provisions governing the issuance of orders relating to the 2 3 public health; amending provisions governing the appointment and oversight of the state health officer; 4 providing applicability; and providing for an effective 5 б date. 7 8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 9 10 Section 1. W.S. 35-1-310 is created to read: 11 12 35-1-310. Limitation on orders. 13 14 (a) Any order issued under this chapter by a county, 15 municipal or district health officer that restricts

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1 individuals' movements or their ability to engage in any 2 activity, that applies to individuals not under an 3 isolation or quarantine order and that is designed to 4 prevent or limit the transmission of a contagious or possibly contagious disease shall be effective for a period 5 of not more than ten (10) days. Subsequent orders, б including order extensions, for the same or substantially 7 8 same purpose of any duration shall only be issued as 9 follows: 10 11 (i) The board of county commissioners, by a vote

12 of the majority of the board, may issue an order subsequent 13 to an order issued by a county health officer;

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(ii) The governing body of a municipality, by a vote of the majority of the governing body, may issue an order subsequent to an order issued by a municipal health officer;

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20 (iii) The governing body of a political 21 subdivision that is a member of a district health 22 department, by a majority vote of the governing body, may 23 issue an order subsequent to an order issued by a district

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health officer to have effect within the governing body's 1 2 political subdivision only. 3 4 Section **2.** W.S. 9-2-103(e)(intro) and (i), 5 21-4-309(d)(i) and 35-1-240(a)(intro) and by creating a new subsection (c) are amended to read: б 7 8 9-2-103. Division administrators; appointment; 9 qualifications; duties; salaries, tenure and removal 10 generally; necessary personnel. 11 12 (e) The director governor shall appoint a state health officer who shall be licensed in Wyoming as a 13 physician and who shall carry out the statutory duties and 14 any other duties assigned to him the state health officer 15 16 by the director. The state health officer shall: 17 18 (i) Answer directly to the director Serve at the pleasure of the director and governor, either of whom may 19 20 remove the state health officer; 21 21-4-309. Mandatory immunizations for 22 children 23 attending schools; exceptions.

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1 2 (d) For purposes of this section: 3 4 (i) "State health officer" means the person 5 appointed by the director of the department of health б governor pursuant to W.S. <u>9-2-103</u>9-2-103(e); 7 35-1-240. Powers and duties. 8 9 10 (a) Subject to subsection (c) of this section, the department of health, through the state health officer, or 11 under his direction and supervision, through the other 12 employees of the department, shall have and exercise the 13 following powers and duties: 14 15 (c) Any order issued under this section that 16 17 restricts individuals' movements or their ability to engage in any activity, that applies to individuals not under an 18 19 isolation or quarantine order and that is designed to 20 prevent or limit the transmission of a contagious or possibly contagious disease shall be effective for a period 21 of not more than ten (10) days. Subsequent orders, 22 including order extensions, for the same or substantially 23

2	duration, with consultation provided by the state health
3	officer.
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5	Section 3. W.S. 9-2-103(d) is repealed.
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7	Section 4. This act shall only apply to orders issued
8	by the state health officer or municipal, county or
9	district health officers on or after the effective date of
10	this act. No order issued before the effective date of this
11	act shall be subject to this act during any period for
12	which the public health order is effective.
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14	Section 5. This act is effective July 1, 2021.
