A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to economic development; requiring the
- 2 Wyoming business council to designate Wyoming economic
- 3 development zones and to assist with applications for
- 4 federal economic development district designation;
- 5 requiring rulemaking; requiring reporting as specified; and
- 6 providing for an effective date.

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8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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10 **Section 1.** W.S. 9-12-115 is created to read:

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9-12-115. Wyoming economic development zones.

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- 14 (a) The council, in consultation with local economic
- 15 development organizations, chambers of commerce and other

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1 state agencies as deemed appropriate by the council, shall

2 designate not less than five (5) Wyoming economic

3 development zones for the purpose of economic development,

4 developing a trained, competitive workforce and the

5 revitalization of economically distressed areas within

6 Wyoming. In designating Wyoming economic development zones,

7 the council shall consider need indicators pursuant to

8 subsection (b) of this section, success indicators pursuant

9 to subsection (c) of this section and the commitment of

10 local leaders to the development of a comprehensive

11 economic development strategy under 13 C.F.R. 303.7.

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13 (b) In making a Wyoming economic development zone

14 designation, the council shall consider the following need

15 indicators:

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17 (i) The extent to which the proposed zone has

18 experienced or is likely to experience a sudden or severe

19 job loss as a result of the closing or downsizing of a

20 business or businesses of economic importance to a local

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21 community;

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1	(ii)	The	extent	to	which	the	median	household
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2 income within the proposed zone is lower than the state

3 median household income;

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5 (iii) The amount of property in or near the

6 proposed zone that is underdeveloped or nonperforming;

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8 (iv) The extent to which property in the

9 proposed zone would remain underdeveloped or nonperforming

10 without a designation.

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12 (c) In making a Wyoming economic development zone

13 designation, the council shall consider the following

14 success indicators:

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16 (i) The strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and

17 threats related to the viability of economic development

18 within the proposed zone;

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20 (ii) The local public and private commitment to

21 development of the proposed zone and the potential

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22 cooperation of the surrounding communities;

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22 (D) Enhanced oil recovery, including

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23 related research and development;

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2	(E) Oil, gas and coal, including any
3	efficiencies or savings generated by integrating renewable
4	energy sources;
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6	(F) Infrastructure, transportation,
7	manufacturing, supply chain integrity and logistics;
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9	(G) Innovation and technology, including
10	broadband deployment and related telecommunications
11	services;
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13	(H) Mining, including rare earth element
14	and critical mineral extraction;
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16	(J) Small to medium sized modular nuclear
17	reactors;

19	(K) Value added agricultural developments;

21	(L) Financial technology and innovation;
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- 1 (M) Any other facilities or industries
- 2 which could be feasibly established, maintained or expanded
- 3 as determined by the council.

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- 5 (d) Prior to making a Wyoming economic development
- 6 zone designation, the council shall coordinate with
- 7 affected counties and municipalities to consider and
- 8 evaluate the need indicators pursuant to subsection (b) of
- 9 this section, the success indicators pursuant to subsection
- 10 (c) of this section and any comprehensive economic
- 11 development strategy established pursuant to 13 C.F.R.
- 12 303.7 which affects those counties and municipalities.

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- 14 (e) The council shall assist and coordinate with the
- 15 local leaders of any Wyoming economic development zone with
- 16 a comprehensive economic development strategy established
- 17 pursuant to 13 C.F.R. 303.7 to apply for designation as an
- 18 economic development district under 13 C.F.R. 304.1.

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- 20 (f) Not later than December 1, 2021 and by every
- 21 October 15 thereafter, the council shall report to the
- 22 joint minerals, business and economic development interim
- 23 committee concerning the Wyoming economic development zones

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1 established under subsection (a) of this section. The

2 report shall include:

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4 (i) Recommendations for legislative or

5 regulatory changes which would support, facilitate or

6 encourage economic development, the development of a

7 trained, competitive workforce and the revitalization of

8 communities within Wyoming economic development zones;

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10 (ii) Recommendations for legislative or

11 regulatory changes which would streamline or simplify the

12 process by which entities establish, site or otherwise

13 locate industries or facilities within Wyoming economic

14 development zones;

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16 (iii) The projected economic impact of each

17 recommended legislative or regulatory change if enacted,

18 including the jobs created and the effect on the local

19 community;

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21 (iv) The status of all Wyoming economic

22 development zones designated by the council, including the

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1 realized economic impact of any enacted legislative or

2 regulatory change.

4 Section 2. Not later than December 1, 2021, the

5 council shall promulgate any rules necessary to administer

6 this act, which shall include the designation of not less

7 than five (5) Wyoming economic development zones.

9 **Section 3.** This act is effective immediately upon

10 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

11 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

12 Constitution.
