2 Any university or college receiving funding from the state 3 of Wyoming shall presume in perpetuity that any college 4 level credit hour previously completed with an acceptable 5 grade in a Wyoming university or college shall remain valid and transferrable to any degree program. The university or 6 college may, on a case-by-case basis, decline to accept the 7 8 presumed credit hour when the previously completed course 9 does not provide the necessary knowledge and skills for the 10 course as administered when the student seeks to apply the 11 credit. The university or college shall reduce to writing 12 and provide to the student the reasons the student's course 13 credit is not accepted. The student may challenge the decision not to accept the credit at a hearing before the 14 15 board of trustees, or its designee, where the student shall 16 have the burden to show the previously completed course provides the necessary knowledge and skills for the course 17 for which the student seeks to apply the credit. If the 18 19 student makes a sufficient showing, the completed course 20 shall satisfy the program requirement for which the student seeks to apply the credit. The Wyoming Administrative 21 Procedure Act shall not apply to the hearing. The board of 22 23 trustees of the university and each college shall establish
