1 Except as otherwise provided in this section, resort liquor licensees shall not sell alcoholic or malt beverages for 2 3 consumption off the premises owned or leased by the 4 licensee, except pursuant to a catering permit. Resort liquor licensees that satisfy the requirements of W.S. 5 <u>12-4-401(d)</u> shall not under any circumstances sell 6 7 alcoholic or malt beverages for consumption off the 8 premises owned or leased by the licensee. The dispensing of alcoholic or malt beverages licensed to be sold hereunder 9 10 shall be controlled by W.S. 12-5-201 and if a catering 11 permit has been issued by W.S. 12-4-502(b). 12 13 Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2022. 14
