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10 (b) A health care provider who delivers volunteer health care services to a low income person pursuant to a 11 12 contract that complies with the requirements of this act, 13 and regardless of whether the low income person who is treated is later found to be ineligible, shall 14 15 considered a public employee of the state while acting 16 within the scope of duties under the contract, but only for 17 the applicability of the purposes of Wyoming 18 Governmental Claims Act, including W.S. 1-39-110. The state 19 of Wyoming shall have the duty to defend a health care 20 provider alleged to have been negligent or alleged to have committed medical malpractice in the provision of volunteer 21
