Source of revenue (decrease):

The revenue decrease would come from an anticipated reduction in the number of new applicants and out of state licenses due to participation in the Psychology Interjurisdictional Compact (Compact).

Assumptions:

The revenue decreases in the table above are based on estimates provided by the Board of Psychology (Board) based on the following assumptions:

Decrease in new license holder application fees: 25 new license holders x \$275 current application fee = \$6,875 12 temporary license holders x \$150 current application fee = \$1,800 Total new license application fee revenue decrease = \$8,675

Decrease in new license holder license fees: 25 new license holders x \$200 license fee = \$5,000

Decrease in license renewal fees: For 2024, 96 license holders x \$200 current renewal fee = \$19,200 For 2025, 42 license holders x \$200 current renewal fee = \$8,400 For 2026, 17 license holders x \$200 current renewal fee = \$3,400

If the Board does experience a revenue decrease, it may seek to increase its application, license and renewals fees.

On its own, this bill will not result in a significant revenue increase from background check fees or require additional personnel and/or funding. However, passage of multiple bills of this type may result in a cumulative administrative impact to the Division of Criminal Investigation.
