A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to supplemental appropriations for the operation of state government for the fiscal biennium commencing July 1, 2022 and ending June 2 3 30, 2024; providing definitions; providing for additional appropriations and 4 transfers of funds for the period of the budget; increasing or decreasing 5 specified amounts; adjusting the number of positions; modifying prior 6 appropriations; providing for duties, terms and conditions and other 7 requirements relating to appropriations for the period of the budget as 8 specified; providing for position and other budgetary limitations; amending 9 existing law by redirecting revenues and making transfers for the period of 10 the budget; providing for carryover of funds beyond the fiscal biennium; and 11 providing for an effective date.
