1 AN ACT relating to the emergency expenses of government; providing definitions; providing appropriations; amending 2 and repealing prior appropriations of COVID-19 relief 3 4 funds; specifying conditions on the appropriation and expenditure of COVID-19 relief funds; amending prior 5 conditions on the reduction and prioritization of COVID-19 6 7 relief funds; providing for the reversion of unexpended and 8 unobligated funds; authorizing emergency government 9 programs; authorizing rulemaking; requiring reporting; 10 specifying applicability; providing for priority of 11 appropriations; and providing for an effective date.
