Pioneer hunting licenses-2.

A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to game and fish; providing for additional
2 eligibility for reduced price hunting licenses; specifying
3 qualifications and providing for fees for specified hunting
4 licenses; and providing for effective dates.

6 *Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:*

7

8 **Section 1.** W.S. 23-1-705(e) is amended to read:

9

10 **23-1-705. Complimentary licenses; one-shot antelope**
11 **hunt licenses; gunpowder and buckskin hunt licenses;**
12 **gratuitous licenses.**

14 (e) The department shall issue:

15

16 (i) For a fee of two dollars (\$2.00) a resident
17 deer or antelope license and for a fee of five dollars

1 (\$5.00) an elk license to any resident who was born on or
2 before January 1, 1930, who has continuously resided in
3 Wyoming for at least the forty (40) years immediately
4 preceding application for the license and who is physically
5 able to personally hunt and pursue his own game; ~~and~~ and

6
7 (ii) For a fee established by rule of the
8 commission a resident deer, antelope or elk license to any
9 resident who was born on or after January 1, 1930, is at
10 least seventy (70) years of age prior to the issuance of
11 the license, has continuously resided in Wyoming for at
12 least fifty (50) years immediately preceding application
13 for the license and is physically able to personally hunt
14 and pursue his own game. The fee established for a license
15 under this paragraph shall be not more than sixty-five
16 percent (65%) nor less than sixty percent (60%) of the
17 resident fee specified in W.S. 23-2-101 for the particular
18 species.

20 **Section 2.** The game and fish commission may adopt
21 rules and regulations implementing the provisions of this
22 act upon the effective date of this section.

24 **Section 3.**

2 (a) Section 2 of this act is effective immediately
3 upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become
4 law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming
5 Constitution.

7 (b) Except as provided in subsection (a) of this
8 section, this act is effective January 1, 2004.
