Annual statement; mandatory reporting of 11 claims against health care providers; confidentiality; 12 abstract of statistics. 13 14 (a) Any insurer writing coverage for health care 15 malpractice in this state, by March 1 of each year, shall 16 file with the commissioner a report of all claims against a 17 health care provider and a report of all awards or 1

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1 settlements given in cases against health care providers. 2 The report shall contain the following information only for 3 the preceding calendar year: 4 5 (iv) For each claim: 6 7 (A) Specialty coverage of the insured; 8 9 Insured's policy number; (B) 10 11 (C) Nature and substance of the claim; 12 13 Date on which the claim arose; (D) 14 15 (E) Age of the claimant or plaintiff; 16 17 (F) After final disposition of the claim, 18 the amounts paid, if any, and the date and manner of 19 disposition, whether by judgment, settlement or otherwise; 20 21 (G) Expenses incurred; and 22 23 (H) Any additional information required by 24 the commissioner.

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2	(v) The number of claims against an insured if
3	more than one (1) claim has been filed against the insured
4	in the preceding calendar year, without revealing the
5	identity of the insured.
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7	(b) The names of health care providers and <mark>shall not</mark>
8	be disclosed in information reported under subsection (a)
9	of this section. Any records pertaining thereto are
10	confidential. The commissioner shall prepare an abstract of
11	all pertinent statistics for inclusion in his annual report
12	to the governor pursuant to W.S. 9-2-1014.
