A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to volunteer health care professionals;
- 2 providing a volunteer license for retired dentists and
- 3 dental hygienists, optometrists, physicians, osteopaths and
- 4 physician assistants as specified; conforming provisions;
- 5 and providing for an effective date.

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7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 9 **Section 1.** W.S. 33-15-131, 33-23-117 and 33-26-601
- 10 are created to read:

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- 12 33-15-131. Dentist and dental hygienist volunteer
- 13 license.

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15 (a) As used in this section:

1 (i) "Low income uninsured person" means a person 2 who meets all of the following requirements: 3 4 (A) The person's income is not greater than 5 two hundred percent (200%) of the current poverty level as defined by federal law, as amended; 6 7 8 (B) The person currently is not receiving 9 medical, disability or other assistance under any federal 10 or state government health care program; and 11 (C) Either of the following applies: 12 13 14 (I) The person is not a policyholder, 15 certificate holder, insured, contract holder, subscriber, enrollee, member, beneficiary or other covered individual 16 17 under a health insurance or health care policy, contract or 18 plan; or

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20 The person is a policyholder, (II) 21 certificate holder, insured, contract holder, subscriber, 22 enrollee, member, beneficiary or other covered individual 23 under a health insurance or health care policy, contract or 24 plan, but the insurer, policy, contract or plan denies

1 coverage or is the subject of insolvency or bankruptcy

2 proceedings in any jurisdiction.

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4 (ii) "Nonprofit health care facility" means a 5 charitable nonprofit corporation or association organized and operated under title 17, chapter 19 or 22 of the 6 Wyoming statutes, or any charitable organization not 7 organized and not operated for profit, that provides health 8 9 care services to low income uninsured persons, except that 10 "health care facility" does not include a hospital, 11 including a swing bed hospital, facility or center defined 12 under W.S. 35-2-901 or any other medical facility that is

16 considered retired from practice if the person's license or
17 certificate has expired.

20 without examination, a volunteer's certificate to a person
21 who is retired from practice so that the person may provide

1 (iii) Evidence of one (1) of the following, as 2 applicable: 3 4 (A) That the applicant has maintained for 5 at least ten (10) years immediately prior to retirement full licensure in good standing in any jurisdiction in the 6 7 United States that licenses persons to practice as a dentist or dental hygienist; or 8 9 10 That the applicant has practiced for at (B) 11 least ten (10) years immediately prior to retirement in good standing as a dentist or dental hygienist in one (1) 12 or more of the branches of the United States armed 13 14 services; and 15 16 (iv) A notarized statement from the applicant, 17 on a form prescribed by the board, that the applicant: 18 19 (A) Will not accept any form of 20 remuneration for any dental or dental hygiene services 21 rendered while in possession of a volunteer's certificate; 22 23 Will devote his practice exclusively (B)

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and totally to providing dental or dental hygiene services

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- 1 to low income uninsured persons at a nonprofit health care
- 2 facility in this state; and

- 4 (C) Will provide any other documentation
- 5 that the board reasonably may require.

- The holder of a volunteer's certificate may 7
- provide dental or dental hygiene services only on the 8
- 9 premises of a nonprofit health care facility in this state
- 10 and only to low income uninsured persons. The holder shall
- 11 not accept any form of remuneration for providing dental or
- 12 dental hygiene services while in possession of the
- 13 certificate. The board may revoke a volunteer's certificate
- 14 on receiving proof satisfactory to the board that the
- 15 holder has engaged in practice in this state outside the
- 16 scope of the certificate.

- (f) A volunteer's certificate shall be valid for a 18
- 19 period of one (1) year, unless earlier revoked under
- 20 subsection (e) of this section or pursuant to title 33,
- 21 chapter 15 of the Wyoming statutes. A volunteer's
- 22 certificate may be renewed upon the application of the
- holder. The board shall maintain a register of all persons 23
- who hold volunteer's certificates. The board shall not 24

1 charge a fee for issuing or renewing a certificate pursuant

2 to this section.

4 (g) To be eligible for renewal of a volunteer's

5 certificate, the holder of the certificate shall certify to

6 the board completion of any continuing education required

7 under this act as if the holder of the certificate were in

8 active practice. The board shall not renew a certificate if

9 the holder has not complied with the continuing education

10 requirements. The nonprofit health care facility in which

11 the holder provides dental or dental hygiene services may

12 pay for or reimburse the holder for any costs incurred in

13 obtaining the required continuing education.

14

15 (h) The board shall issue to each person who

16 qualifies under this section a volunteer's certificate that

17 states the certificate holder is authorized to provide

18 dental or dental hygiene services pursuant to the laws of

19 this state.

20

21 (j) Except as provided in this section, any person

22 holding a volunteer's certificate issued by the board under

23 this section shall be subject to the requirements of this

24 act and the jurisdiction of the board as if he were

1 licensed to practice dentistry or dental hygiene under this

2 act.

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4 (k) The board shall adopt rules to administer and

5 enforce this section.

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7 33-23-117. Optometry volunteer license.

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9 (a) As used in this section, "low income uninsured

10 person" and "nonprofit health care facility" have the same

11 meanings as in W.S. 33-15-131(a).

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13 (b) For purposes of this section, a person shall be

14 considered retired from practice if the person's license or

certificate has expired. 15

16

17 The state board of optometry may issue, without

examination, a volunteer certificate to a person who is 18

19 retired from practice so that the person may provide

20 optometry services to low income uninsured persons at

21 nonprofit health care facilities. The board shall deny

22 issuance of a volunteer's certificate to a person who is

not qualified under this section to hold a volunteer's 23

certificate. 24

2 (d) An application for a volunteer's certificate 3 shall include all of the following:

5 (i) A copy of the applicant's optometry degree;

6

7 (ii) One (1) of the following, as applicable:

9 (A) A copy of the applicant's most recent

10 license or certificate authorizing the practice of

11 optometry issued by a jurisdiction in the United States

12 that licenses persons to practice optometry; or

13

14 (B) A copy of the applicant's most recent

15 license equivalent to a license to practice optometry in

16 one (1) or more branches of the United States armed

17 services that the United States government issued.

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19 (iii) Evidence of one (1) of the following, as

20 applicable:

22 (A) That the applicant has maintained for

23 at least ten (10) years immediately prior to retirement

24 full licensure in good standing in any jurisdiction in the

1 United States that licenses persons to practice optometry;

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- 4 (B) That the applicant has practiced for at
- 5 least ten (10) years immediately prior to retirement in
- 6 good standing as an optometrist in one (1) or more of the
- 7 branches of the United States armed services; and

- 9 (iv) A notarized statement from the applicant,
- 10 on a form prescribed by the board, that the applicant:

- 12 (A) Will not accept any form of
- 13 remuneration for any optometric services rendered while in
- 14 possession of a volunteer certificate;

15

- 16 (B) Will devote his practice exclusively
- 17 and totally to providing medical services to low income
- 18 uninsured persons at a nonprofit health care facility in
- 19 this state; and

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- 21 (C) Will provide any other documentation
- 22 that the board reasonably may require.

(e) The holder of a volunteer's certificate may 1 provide optometric services only on the premises of a 2 3 nonprofit health care facility in this state and only to 4 low income uninsured persons. The holder shall not accept 5 any form of remuneration for providing optometric services while in possession of the certificate. The board may 6 7 revoke a volunteer's certificate on receiving satisfactory to the board that the holder has engaged in 8 9 practice in this state outside the scope of the

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certificate.

12 (f) A volunteer's certificate shall be valid for a 13 period of one (1) year, unless earlier revoked under subsection (e) of this section or pursuant to title 33, 14 chapter 23 of the Wyoming statutes. A volunteer's 15 16 certificate may be renewed upon the application of the 17 holder. The board shall maintain a register of all persons who hold volunteer's certificates. The board shall not 18 charge a fee for issuing or renewing a certificate pursuant 19 20 to this section.

5 on a form prescribed by the board, that the applicant:

7 (A) Will not accept any form of

remuneration for any medical services rendered while in 8

9 possession of a volunteer's license;

11 (B) Will devote his practice exclusively

and totally to providing medical services to low income 12

13 uninsured persons at a nonprofit health care facility in

14 this state; and

16 (C) Will provide any other documentation

17 that the board reasonably may require.

18

19 The holder of a volunteer's license may provide

20 medical services only on the premises of a nonprofit health

21 care facility in this state and only to low income

22 uninsured persons. The holder shall not accept any form of

remuneration for providing medical services while 23

24 possession of the license. The board may revoke a 1 volunteer's license on receiving proof satisfactory to the

- 2 board that the holder has engaged in practice in this state
- 3 outside the scope of the license.

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- 5 (f) A volunteer's license shall be valid for a period
- 6 of one (1) year, unless earlier revoked under subsection
- 7 (e) of this section or pursuant to title 33, chapter 26 of
- 8 the Wyoming statutes. A volunteer's license may be renewed
- 9 upon the application of the holder. The board shall
- 10 maintain a register of all persons who hold volunteer's
- 11 licenses. The board shall not charge a fee for issuing or
- 12 renewing a license pursuant to this section.

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- 14 (g) To be eligible for renewal of a volunteer's
- 15 license, the holder of the license shall certify to the
- 16 board completion of any continuing education required under
- 17 this chapter as if the holder of the license were in active
- 18 practice. The board shall not renew a license if the holder
- 19 has not complied with the continuing education
- 20 requirements. The nonprofit health care facility in which
- 21 the holder provides medical services may pay for or
- 22 reimburse the holder for any costs incurred in obtaining
- 23 the required continuing education.
