- 14 subsection, the department shall, not less than every five
- 15 (5) years, establish a new base period to be used in
- 16 calculating all skilled nursing homes' medical assistance

1 per diem base rate reimbursable under this chapter, using

2 the most recent cost report information provided to the

3 department. For purposes of medical assistance reimbursable

4 under this chapter, the department shall reimburse each

5 eligible provider of skilled nursing home services the

6 greater of the following amounts:

(i) Medical assistance computed on the per diem 8

9 base rate under the new base period established pursuant to

10 this subsection; or

12 (ii) For the state fiscal year beginning July 1,

2003 and ending June 30, 2004, medical assistance computed 13

14 on the per diem base rate existing prior to the

establishment of the new base period under this subsection. 15

17 Section 2. Five hundred fifty thousand dollars

(\$550,000.00) is appropriated from the general fund to the 18

19 department of health for purposes of medical assistance to

20 skilled nursing homes for the fiscal period commencing July

21 1, 2003 and ending June 30, 2004. For the state fiscal year

beginning July 1, 2003, only, the medicaid reimbursement 22

23 rates for skilled nursing home services shall be adjusted

24 and computed to implement the provisions of this act. 2 Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2003.
