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1 shall apply to each package shipment of radioactive 2 materials transported through this state. The department 3 of transportation shall collect this fee based on a permit 4 issued by the department which is not inconsistent with 5 federal law. The department shall promulgate rules on issuing and revoking permits which are not inconsistent 6 7 with federal law. The department shall promulgate rules on quarterly reporting and payment of fees, retention of 8 9 records and audit requirements. All emergency response fees 10 shall be deposited in a fund within the special revenue 11 fund to be used by the Wyoming emergency management agency 12 with the approval of the governor for the payment of costs 13 associated with training for and conducting emergency 14 preparedness for, response procedures related to, the 15 transportation of and recovery of, incidents involving 16 radioactive class 7 materials as defined in 49 C.F.R. 17 173.403(1), as amended as of August 28, 2001. Nothing in this subsection shall affect the liability of the person 18 responsible for an incident involving the transportation of 19 20 radioactive and hazardous materials. 21

8	established pursuant to section 135 of the federal "Nuclear
9	Waste Policy Act of 1982" as amended, 42 U.S.C. 10101 et
10	seq., to any or repository licensed for the permanent deep
11	geological storage or disposal of high-level radioactive
12	waste, transuranic waste and spent nuclear fuel., or to any
13	monitored retrievable storage facility established pursuant
14	to section 141 of the federal "Nuclear Waste Policy Act of
15	1982" as amended.
