Wyoming's wildlife.

A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to wildlife; asserting the state's  
2 exclusive jurisdiction over wildlife; prohibiting  
3 activities in conflict with that exclusive jurisdiction;  
4 imposing specified duties upon the game and fish commission  
5 pertaining to wildlife introduced within this state;  
6 requiring reports; and providing for an effective date.

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8 *Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:*

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10 **Section 1.** W.S. 23-1-302 by creating new subsections  
11 (m) and (n) is amended to read:

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13 **23-1-302. Powers and duties.**

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15 (m) For purposes of mitigating detrimental impacts to  
16 Wyoming from the introduction of any wildlife species

1 including endangered species, which have been or may be  
2 introduced, planted or propagated in Wyoming excluding  
3 Yellowstone National Park by any person, including any  
4 federal agency, unless otherwise permitted by this act the  
5 commission shall:

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7 (i) Prohibit by rule any such introduction,  
8 reintroduction, propagation or management of any wildlife  
9 species within the boundaries of Wyoming excluding  
10 Yellowstone National Park by any person, including any  
11 federal agency, other than the department;

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13 (ii) Demand reimbursement from the federal  
14 government and seek compensation for damages to Wyoming  
15 wildlife and wildlife habitat caused by any species,  
16 including endangered species, introduced within Wyoming  
17 under federal mandate or programs;

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19 (iii) Except for damages qualifying under W.S.  
20 23-1-901, assist any landowner, lessee, outfitter or agent  
21 whose property or livelihood is being damaged by any  
22 endangered species introduced within Wyoming under federal  
23 mandate or programs, in seeking reimbursement and other  
24 assistance from the federal government;

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**Section 2.**

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(iv) On behalf of Wyoming, demand the removal of such detrimental species introduced within Wyoming by the federal government.

(n) For purposes of proper management of all wildlife species within Wyoming, the commission shall:

(i) Notify all federal agencies operating within Wyoming, whose duties directly affect wildlife, public lands or the environment, that Wyoming has sole jurisdiction over any and all wildlife existing within Wyoming excluding Yellowstone National Park and will exercise exclusive management of all wildlife.

(a) For the purpose of assuring compliance with the terms of this act:

(i) Not later than September 1, 2003, the commission shall report to the joint travel, recreation and wildlife committee regarding the responsiveness and

1 cooperation of the federal government in enabling the  
2 commission in carrying out its duties under this act;

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4 (ii) The attorney general shall prepare a plan  
5 considering potential litigation for the state of Wyoming  
6 to establish its sole management authority over all species  
7 of wildlife within its boundaries excluding Yellowstone  
8 National Park and to require the federal government to  
9 immediately transfer to the state of Wyoming all  
10 responsibility for the management and protection of any and  
11 all species of wildlife within the state of Wyoming  
12 excluding Yellowstone National Park. The plan, together  
13 with the attorney general's estimate of the potential cost  
14 of such litigation, shall be forwarded to the joint travel,  
15 recreation and wildlife committee not later than September  
16 1, 2003. The attorney general shall also include advice  
17 regarding which federal areas other than Yellowstone  
18 National Park should be excluded from sole management  
19 authority by the state of Wyoming.

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1           **Section 3.**    This act is effective immediately upon  
2 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law  
3 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming  
4 Constitution.
