Health care commission.

A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to health care; establishing a health care commission within the governor's office; providing for 2 3 membership; authorizing an advisory board as specified; 4 specifying duties; requiring the commission to submit its 5 recommendations to the legislature as specified; authorizing the commission to hire a director and staff; 6 7 providing an appropriation; providing for the termination of the commission, board and staff positions as specified; 8 and providing for an effective date. 9

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11 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 12

13 Section 1. W.S. 9-2-2801 through 9-2-2805 are created 14 to read:

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9-2-2801. Health care commission created; membership; 1 2 salary; meetings; termination. 3 4 (a) The Wyoming health care commission is established 5 within the governor's office to study issues related to the access, cost and quality of health care for Wyoming 6 7 citizens. 8 9 (b) The commission shall consist of fifteen (15) 10 members appointed by the governor including: 11 12 (i) The director of the department of health, or 13 designee; 14 (ii) The director of the department of family 15 services, or designee; 16 17 18 (iii) The governor's policy advisor on health and human services; 19 20 21 (iv) The director of the department of workforce 22 services, or designee; 23

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(v) The dean of the University of Wyoming 1 2 college of health sciences, or designee; 3 4 (vi) The Wyoming insurance commissioner, or 5 designee; 6 7 (vii) Nine (9) residents of the state appointed at large. 8 9 (c) Appointed commission members shall serve until 10 11 completion of duties delegated to the commission under this 12 article. If a vacancy occurs on the commission, the 13 governor shall appoint a new member to fill the vacancy for the remainder of the term. The governor may remove members 14 as provided in W.S. 9-1-202. Commission members who are not 15 state employees shall receive a salary equal to the per 16 17 diem paid members of the Wyoming legislature under W.S. 18 28-5-101 for each day of actual service and when engaged in necessary travel plus necessary expenses. 19 20

21 (d) The governor shall designate one (1) member to 22 serve as chairman.

Eight (8) members shall 3 constitute a quorum. 4 5 (f) As used in this article, "commission" means the Wyoming health care commission created by this section. 6 7 8 9-2-2802. Advisory board; membership; salary; 9 termination. 10 (a) There is created an advisory board to assist the 11 commission as necessary, consisting of the following 12 13 members appointed by the governor: 14 15 (i) A physician licensed in Wyoming; 16 17 (ii) A registered nurse licensed in Wyoming; 18 19 (iii) A pharmacist licensed in Wyoming; 20 21 (iv) A representative of a hospital; 22 23 (v) A provider of long term care services; 24

2003 STATE OF WYOMING 03LSO-0219 (vi) An attorney licensed in Wyoming; 1 2 3 (vii) A representative for a health care insurer 4 operating in Wyoming; 5 (viii) An uninsured resident of the state; 6 7 (ix) A representative for a pharmaceutical 8 9 manufacturer; 10 (x) A representative involved in K-12 school 11 12 education; 13 (xi) Representatives for large and small 14 15 employers; 16 17 (xii) A representative for senior citizens; and 18 19 (xiii) Other persons appointed by the governor 20 in consultation with the commission. 21 22 (b) Advisory board members shall serve until 23 completion of duties delegated to the commission under this article. If a vacancy occurs on the board, the governor 24

3	provided in W.S. 9-1-202. Services rendered by advisory
4	board members shall be voluntary and shall not be
5	compensated, except for meal, lodging and travel expenses
6	as provided in W.S. 9-3-102 and 9-3-103.
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8	(c) Members of the advisory board shall meet at the
9	call of the chairman of the commission. Members of the
10	board may be appointed to serve as subcommittees of the
11	commission, rather than as an advisory board to the
12	commission.

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(ii) Perform duties prescribed by the commission 1 2 and assist the commission in carrying out the duties 3 imposed under this article; and 4 5 (iii) Not be subject to W.S. 9-2-1019, 9-2-1022 and 9-3-101 through 9-3-104 but shall receive compensation 6 7 and be reimbursed for travel and other necessary expenses as prescribed by the commission and approved by the 8 9 governor. 10 11 (b) Subject to approval by the commission, the 12 director may employ one (1) staff member to assist the 13 commission in performing its duties. The staff member shall

14 possess those administrative, technical, professional and 15 clerical qualifications determined necessary by the 16 commission. All staff to the commission shall serve at the 17 pleasure of the director.

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19 (c) The commission may contract for services with 20 nationally recognized health care systems experts as 21 necessary to assist in the technical aspects of data 22 development, review and analysis.

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(a) 4 The commission shall develop strategies to 5 improve health care and reduce health care and medical liability insurance costs for Wyoming citizens by holding 6 public meetings throughout the state, hearing from experts 7 and other interested parties, studying and researching 8 9 other states' actions on health care and medical liability 10 insurance reform, studying and utilizing Wyoming data, 11 considering past efforts, including, but not limited to, 12 the report issued by the Wyoming health reform commission 13 on December 1, 1994, and future possibilities that can be 14 useful in decision making by addressing the following: 15 16 (i) Access to an affordable, effective and

17 quality health care system for Wyoming, including rural 18 areas of the state;

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2003 STATE OF WYOMING 03LSO-0219 1 (iv) Disease prevention and management; 2 3 (v) Medical liability insurance reform; 4 5 (vi) Workforce shortages among medical provider professions; 6 7 (vii) Cost shifting by medical providers that 8 occurs as a result of low reimbursement from public and 9 10 other programs; 11 12 (viii) The aging population in Wyoming and the long term care services that will be needed by that 13 population; 14 15 16 (ix) Other issues as deemed appropriate by the 17 governor and the commission. 18 19 (b) The commission shall consult and coordinate 20 with the state planning grant task force within the 21 department of health on issues relating to health 22 insurance. 23

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(c) The commission shall submit to the joint labor, 1 2 health and social services interim committee and the 3 governor a preliminary report on its findings no later than 4 June 30, 2004, and a final report with its recommendations 5 for legislative changes by December 1, 2004. 6 (d) Public hearings of the commission shall be held 7 in accordance with W.S. 16-4-401 et seq. The attorney 8 9 general shall be the legal adviser of the commission. 10 9-2-2805. Termination of article. 11 12 13 W.S. 9-2-2801 through 9-2-2804 are repealed effective June 30, 2005. 14 15 16 Section 2. There is appropriated three hundred fifty 17 thousand dollars (\$350,000.00) from the general fund to the governor's office for the period beginning April 1, 2003 18 through December 30, 2004 to implement the purposes of this 19 20 act. Notwithstanding W.S. 9-4-207, the appropriation under 21 this section shall not lapse at the end of the biennium 22 ending June 30, 2004.

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1	Section 3. This act is effective immediately upon
2	completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law
3	as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming
4	Constitution.
