2	prohibiting the use of names and the purchase of lists of
3	names derived from public records for commercial purposes
4	without consent; providing exceptions and penalties;
5	requiring disclosure of intent to commercially use a
6	consumer's information under the Wyoming Consumer
7	Protection Act; and providing for an effective date.

11	Section 1. W.S. 16-4-206 and 16-4-207 are created to

STATE OF WYOMING

(a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this 1 2 section, no custodian or official custodian shall 3 distribute for commercial purposes or sell for use as a 4 list any public record without first securing the 5 permission of all persons whose names appear on the list. 6 (b) Subsection (a) of this section does not apply to 7 the following: 8 9 10 (i) Requests by any law enforcement agency; 11 12 (ii) Lists developed by the secretary of state; 13 14 (iii) Lists of names, addresses and other information pertaining to electors or candidates when used 15 16 solely for political campaign or election purposes; 17 18 (iv) Lists provided solely for prelicensing or continuing educational courses required for professions; 19 20 and 21 22 (v) Lists of current or retired employees used by the state of Wyoming. 23 24

18	licensed, registered or issued certificates or permits to
19	practice a profession or vocation may be sold or given to,
20	or received by an organization of persons who practice that
21	profession or vocation for membership, informational or
22	other purposes related to the practice of the profession or
23	vocation;

(ii) Lists of names and addresses of persons 1 applying for examination for licenses, registrations, 2 3 certificates or permits to practice a profession or 4 vocation may be sold or given to, and received by 5 organizations providing professional or vocational educational materials or courses for the sole purpose of 6 7 providing information relating to the availability of those materials or courses; 8 9 10 (iii) Lists of names and addresses of persons who have given their permission to a custodian or official 11 custodian as required by W.S. 16-4-206 may be received, 12 13 used, resold or otherwise transferred to another person. 14 15 (c) Any person violating the provisions of subsection 16 (a) of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable 17 by a fine of not more than seven hundred fifty dollars

1 2 (a) As used in this act: 3 4 (viii) "This act" means W.S. 16-4-201 through 5 $\frac{16-4-205}{16-4-207}$ 6 7 40-12-105. Unlawful practices. 8 9 (a) A person engages in a deceptive trade practice unlawful under this act when, in the course of his business 10 11 and in connection with a consumer transaction, he 12 knowingly: 13 14 (xvi) Fails to disclose at the beginning of the 15 transaction, in a clear and conspicuous manner, that he 16 intends to sell, rent or exchange the consumer's name, 17 address or other personal information. No person who has failed to disclose this intent shall sell, rent or exchange 18 19 information protected by this paragraph without that 20 consumer's written approval. 21 22 Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2003. 23 24 (END)
