A BILL

for

1	AN ACT relating to a Wyoming senior services board;
2	creating a board, providing for membership and duties of
3	the board; specifying the distribution of funds;
4	authorizing rules and regulations; requiring reports;
5	providing definitions; providing an appropriation; and
6	providing for an effective date.
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8	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:
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10	Section 1. W.S. 9-2-1210 through 9-2-1215 are created
11	to read:
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13	9-2-1210. Wyoming senior services board created.
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15	There is created the Wyoming senior services board managed
16	by the division on aging. The division shall consult with

the board to determine the award of grants under W.S. 1 2 9-2-1214. 3 4 9-2-1211. Wyoming senior services board; members; 5 expenses. 6 7 (a) The Wyoming senior services board shall consist of seven (7) members, as follows: 8 9 10 (i) The administrator of the division on aging 11 within the department of health or his designee; 12 13 (ii) One (1) member of the advisory council on aging appointed by the governor; 14 15 16 (iii) Three (3) persons who are senior citizens 17 appointed by the governor; 18 19 (iv) One (1) member of the senate appointed by 20 the president of the senate; 21 22 (v) One (1) member of the house of 23 representatives appointed by the speaker of the house of 24 representatives.

2 The terms of members appointed under paragraphs (b) 3 (a) (ii) and (iii) of this section shall be for four (4) 4 years. Legislators shall serve only for the term of office 5 during which they were appointed. Of the initial appointees under paragraph (a) (iii) of this section, two (2) members 6 shall be appointed for two (2) years and one (1) member 7 shall be appointed for four (4) years. The governor may 8 9 remove any member appointed under paragraph (a) (ii) or 10 (iii) of this section as provided in W.S. 9-1-202. A 11 vacancy on the board shall be filled for the balance of the 12 unexpired term. The board shall select one (1) of its 13 members to serve as chairman.

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15 (c) The board shall meet not less than two (2) times each year. Members shall serve without compensation but 16 17 shall be reimbursed for expenses incurred in the performance of their official duties in the manner and 18 19 amounts provided by law for state employees. Members who 20 are government employees or public officials shall be 21 considered on official business of their agency when 22 performing duties as members of the board.

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1 2 The Wyoming senior services board shall: (a) 3 (i) Review innovative program grants and grant 4 5 proposals; 6 7 (ii) Approve criteria for grant categories and grant applications through rules and regulations 8 9 promulgated by the division on aging to meet the following public purposes: 10 11 12 (A) meet the demands of Wyoming's То 13 growing elderly population; 14 15 (B) To enhance services to Wyoming's senior 16 citizens; 17 18 (C) To strengthen the opportunity for senior citizens to age in the least restrictive environment 19 20 possible; 21 22 (D) To be cost effective in the provision 23 of services to senior citizens; 24

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1 (E) To promote compliance with federal and 2 state mandates requiring placement of people in the least 3 restrictive environment; and 4 5 (F) To supplement and enhance existing programs providing services to senior citizens in the 6 7 state. 8 9 (iii) Review and monitor the expenditure of monies awarded under W.S. 9-2-1214; 10 11 12 (iv) In consultation with the division on aging, 13 promulgate reasonable rules and regulations in accordance with the Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act to implement 14 the provisions of W.S. 9-2-1210 through 9-2-1215; and 15 16 17 (v) Consider other necessary matters. 18 In fulfilling its duties under subsection (a) of 19 (b) 20 this section, the board shall: 21 22 (i) Consult with the division on aging and the advisory council on aging appointed pursuant to W.S. 23 9-2-1206, as necessary; 24

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1 2 (ii) Accept federal grants and other 3 contributions, grants, gifts, bequests and donations from 4 any source. 5 9-2-1213. Division on aging; duties. 6 7 (a) The division on aging shall: 8 9 10 (i) Maintain, manage and be responsible for the 11 distribution of the funds appropriated for distribution 12 under W.S. 9-2-1214; 13 14 (ii) Disburse the funds appropriated in accordance with awards made by the board pursuant to W.S. 15 9-2-1214. 16 17 18 9-2-1214. Disbursement of grants. 19 20 (a) From the funds available for distribution, the 21 board may award grants to senior centers throughout the 22 state to support the purposes specified in W.S. 9-2-1212(a)(ii). The division on aging shall disburse the 23

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1 funds in accordance with awards made by the board under 2 this section.

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4 (b) Notwithstanding W.S. 9-4-207, unobligated or 5 unencumbered funds retained by the division on aging under 6 this section shall not lapse at the end of a fiscal period 7 and shall remain available for distribution as provided in 8 this section.

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10 (c) The board, in consultation with the division on 11 aging, shall by rule and regulation establish a formula for 12 distribution of funds available for distribution under this 13 section as follows:

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15 (i) Each eligible senior center in the state may 16 receive a basic grant not to exceed twenty thousand dollars 17 (\$20,000.00) from the funds available for distribution;

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(ii) Of the amounts remaining after the basic grants are awarded, the board shall award grants to eligible senior centers based on the formula developed by the division on aging and approved by the board.

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1	(d) If the local government entity having
2	jurisdiction in the locality where a grantee is situated
3	reduces its financial support for a grantee who receives
4	funds under this section, the grantee shall have its award
5	reduced in the subsequent fiscal year by an amount equal to
6	the amount of reduction in funds from the local government
7	entity.

9	9-2-1215. Biennial report by board.
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11	Beginning September 1, 2003, the board shall report to the
12	division on aging, the governor and the joint labor, health
13	and social services interim committee no later than
14	September 1 of each odd-numbered year with respect to the
15	grants awarded, and how those grants have benefited senior
16	citizens in the state.
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18	Section 2. W.S. 9-2-1201(a) is amended to read:
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20	9-2-1201. Definitions.
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22	(a) As used in this act:
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1	(i) "Board" means the Wyoming senior services
2	advisory board created by W.S. 9-2-1211;
3	
4	(ii) "Division on aging" means the division
5	within the Wyoming department of health designated pursuant
6	to W.S. 9-2-1302(a)(iv);
7	
8	(iii) "Senior center" means an organization that
9	receives funds under the federal administration on aging
10	Title IIIB supportive services program or Title IIIC
11	nutrition program, excluding organizations that only
12	receive Title IIIB supportive services funds used
13	exclusively for transportation. The term "senior center"
14	may include a community facility or statewide service,
15	which is the focal point for providing a broad spectrum of
16	services including health, mental health, social,
17	nutritional, recreational and educational services for
18	senior citizens;
19	
20	(i) (iv) "Senior citizen" means any person sixty
21	(60) years of age or older;
22	
23	(ii)(v) "This act" means W.S. 9-2-1201 through
24	9-2-1208-9-2-1215.

2	Section 3. There is appropriated two million five
3	hundred thousand dollars (\$2,500,000.00) from the general
4	fund to the division on aging to administer the Wyoming
5	senior services board and to provide grants authorized by
6	this act for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003.
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8	Section 4. This act is effective July 1, 2003.
