Child 11 health insurance program 12 eligibility. 13 14 Subject to approval of the state plan by the United States secretary of health and human services, and subject to 15 available state and federal funding the department shall 16 17 provide a health insurance plan offered through a private insurance company licensed by the insurance commissioner to 18 write insurance in Wyoming for an eligible child whose 19 20 gross family income is not more than two hundred percent 21 (200%) of the federal poverty level. A child who is 22 determined eligible to receive benefits under this section shall remain eligible for twelve (12) months as long as the 23 24 child resides in the state of Wyoming and has not yet

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1 attained nineteen (19) years of age. A child's eligibility 2 to receive benefits under this act shall be redetermined on 3 an annual basis. A simplified application process, which 4 includes minimum eligibility requirements, shall be 5 provided throughout the state at various public and private establishments approved by the department of health. To be 6 determined eligible to receive benefits under this section, 7 a child shall not be eligible under the Wyoming Medical 8 9 Assistance and Services Act, shall not have been covered 10 under another health insurance plan for a minimum of one 11 (1) month prior to application for coverage under this act or, upon birth, the child would not otherwise be covered by 12 13 a public or private health insurance plan. Eligibility 14 under this section shall be determined by the department of 15 health or its designee.

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17 **35-25-104**. Private insurance program benefits.

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19 A child eligible for services under this act shall receive 20 benefits developed by the health benefits committee 21 established under W.S. 35-25-105 that include cost sharing 22 factors, not to exceed the maximum allowable under Public 23 Law 105-33, exclusions and limitations. The benefit package 24 shall include, at a minimum, inpatient and outpatient

1 hospital services, physician services, laboratory and x-ray 2 services, well-baby and well-child care including age 3 appropriate immunizations and the additional services of 4 prescription drug coverage, vision coverage and dental 5 coverage which will include preventive and basic services developed by the health benefits committee. 6 7 35-25-105. Health benefits plan committee. 8 9 10 (a) A health benefits plan committee is hereby 11 established and shall be composed of ten (10) members, 12 which include: 13 14 (i) The director of the Wyoming department of health or his designee; 15 16 17 (ii) The director of the Wyoming department of family services or his designee; 18 19 20 (iii) The Wyoming insurance commissioner or his 21 designee; 22 23 (iv) One (1) representative each, appointed by 24 the governor, consisting of:

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1 2 authorized (A) An insurer writing 3 individual and group health insurance business in Wyoming; 4 5 (B) An employer; 6 7 (C) A parent; 8 9 (D) A licensed insurance agent experienced 10 in selling health insurance; 11 12 A licensed physician who specializes in (E) 13 pediatric care or family medicine; 14 15 (F) A licensed health care provider 16 experienced in providing pediatric care; and 17 18 (G) A member of the general public. 19 20 (b) The terms of the committee members appointed by 21 the governor shall be four (4) years. Members of the 22 committee appointed prior to July 1, 2003 may continue to serve the remainder of their terms. The committee shall 23

Private health insurance plan request for 22 proposals. 23

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1 (a) The department shall publish notice of a request 2 for proposals from qualified insurers to provide a health insurance plan for children insured under W.S. 35-25-103 of 3 4 this act. The department shall award the contract for this 5 service to an insurer based on price, the provision of benchmark services determined pursuant 6 to W.S. 35-25-105(c), and other factors listed in the department's 7 request. The contract for health insurance awarded under 8 9 this section shall contain provisions with respect to 10 exclusions from coverage for preexisting conditions that are no more restrictive than those described in section 11 12 2102 (b)(1)(B)(ii) of Public Law 105-33. The contract 13 shall include provisions for changes in terms and 14 conditions and for rebidding in case major changes are needed. The department shall have the right to rebid the 15 16 contract after two (2) years.

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(b) Biennially, the department may allow the contractor to adjust the price charged for the coverage, but if the price is increased, the department may, after public notice, rebid the contract.

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(c) If the department does not receive a proposalfrom an insurance company within one hundred twenty (120)

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1 days after issuing the request for proposals required in 2 subsection (a) of this section, the department may provide 3 services to children eligible under this act with a public 4 health benefit package designed to provide the same 5 services as authorized under the Wyoming Medical Assistance and Services Act. A medical provider who accepts payment 6 for services provided under this subsection shall not 7 charge or attempt to collect payments in excess of the rate 8 9 schedule established by the department of health.

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15 (a) The department shall project monthly expenditures 16 under this act each month through the end of the biennium 17 based upon the level of activity for the previous months and the trend in expenditures compared to previous 18 expenditures. If the projections indicate that expenditures 19 20 may exceed the federal and state funds available under this 21 act, the department, may, by rule and regulation and 22 subject to availability of funds, limit participation in 23 the program under this section as follows:

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1 (i) The department may impose a partial or total 2 moratorium on new enrollments in the programs under this 3 act until funds are available to meet the needs of new 4 enrollees;

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6 (ii) For current recipients of benefits under 7 this act, priority for the continuation of funding shall be 8 given to those families with the lowest incomes.

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10 (b) In the last six (6) months of the biennium, the 11 department shall include a projection of expenditures for 12 the next biennium based on the spending for the current 13 biennium unless the legislature provides for a different 14 level of funding for the next biennium.

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16 funding for the child health insurance (C) The 17 program shall be deemed to be included within the community and family health division line item within the department 18 of health budget unless a separate line item is provided in 19 20 the budget bill. General fund expenditures for the child 21 health program shall not exceed the amount needed to match 22 federal funds without explicit authorization enacted in the 23 budget bill.

Implementation; duties; restrictions on 1 2 the department of health. 3 4 (a) The department shall: 5 6 (i) Administer this act within the fiscal 7 constraints of Public Law 105-33 and subsequent federal enactments governing this program and the state budget as 8 9 enacted by the legislature; 10 (ii) Develop a state plan for child health 11 12 insurance to qualified recipients under this act and otherwise provide for the effective administration of this 13 14 act; 15 (iii) Maintain records on the administration of 16 17 this act and report to the federal government as required by federal law and regulation; 18 19 20 (iv) Adopt, amend and rescind rules and 21 regulations on the administration of this act following 22 notice and public hearing in accordance with the Wyoming 23 Administrative Procedure Act; 24

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1 (v) Establish indicators for measuring access, 2 process, quality and outcomes effectiveness in improving 3 children's health. 4 5 (b) The department shall not implement: 6 The program under this act until a state 7 (i) plan has been approved by the United States secretary of 8 9 health and human services; and 10 11 (ii) Any state plan that does not conform to the 12 requirements of this act. 13 14 Section 2. W.S. 35-25-109 and 35-25-110 are repealed. 15 Section 3. Notwithstanding W.S. 35-25-108(b), as 16 17 recreated in section 1 of this act, if the department has not received federal approval of the state plan required 18 under W.S. 35-25-108(a)(ii), as recreated in section 1 of 19 20 this act, by July 1, 2003, the department shall continue to 21 provide services under the child health insurance program 22 as authorized by the legislature in 1999 Wyoming session laws, chapter 137, to children found eligible for services 23 under W.S. 35-25-103, as created by that act until the plan 24

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1 required under W.S. 35-25-108(a)(ii), as recreated in 2 section 1 of this act receives federal approval and is 3 ready for implementation by the department. The department 4 shall certify the date of the federal approval of the state 5 plan, and submit a copy of the approval, to the governor and the joint labor, health and social services interim 6 7 committee. The governor shall certify to the secretary of state that the state plan has been approved and the date 8 9 the department has begun implementing the child health 10 insurance program as authorized under this act.
