1 (a) An account within the trust and agency fund is 2 established which shall be referred to as the Wyoming older 3 Americans' trust fund. The trust fund shall consist of 4 those funds designated to the account by law and other 5 contributions, grants, gifts, bequests and donations to the 6 trust fund.

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monies deposited into the trust fund 8 (b) The 9 established pursuant to this section are inviolate and 10 constitute a permanent or perpetual trust fund. The monies 11 shall be transmitted to the state treasurer for credit to 12 the trust fund and shall be invested by the state treasurer 13 as authorized under W.S. 9-4-711 in a manner to obtain the 14 highest return possible consistent with the preservation of the corpus. The investment interest earned from investment 15 16 of the corpus of the trust fund shall be annually credited 17 by the state treasurer not later than June 30 of each year as follows: 18

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(i) All investment interest earned up to an amount equal to five percent (5%) of the corpus of the trust fund shall be deposited into a separate account within the trust and agency fund and distributed in accordance with W.S. 9-2-1214;

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1 2 (ii) Any investment interest earned in excess of 3 the amount specified in paragraph (i) of this subsection 4 shall be credited by the state treasurer to the trust fund 5 established by subsection (a) of this section. 6 9-2-1211. Wyoming senior services board; creation; 7 8 members; expenses. 9 10 (a) There is created the Wyoming senior services board. The board shall consist of seven (7) members, as 11 12 follows: 13 14 (i) The administrator of the division on aging within the department of health or his designee; 15 16 17 (ii) One (1) member of the advisory council on aging appointed by the governor; 18 19 20 (iii) Three (3) persons who are senior citizens 21 appointed by the governor; 22 23 (iv) One (1) member of the senate appointed by 24 the president of the senate; 3

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2 (v) One (1) member of the house of 3 representatives appointed by the speaker of the house of 4 representatives.

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The terms of members appointed under paragraphs 6 (b) (a) (ii) and (iii) of this section shall be for four (4) 7 years. Legislators shall serve only for the term of office 8 9 during which they were appointed. Of the initial appointees 10 under paragraph (a) (iii) of this section, two (2) members 11 shall be appointed for two (2) years and one (1) member 12 shall be appointed for four (4) years. The governor may 13 remove any member appointed under paragraph (a) (ii) or (iii) of this section as provided in W.S. 9-1-202. A 14 vacancy on the board shall be filled for the balance of the 15 16 unexpired term. The board shall select one (1) of its 17 members to serve as chairman.

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The board shall meet not less than two (2) times 19 (C) 20 each year. Members shall serve without compensation but 21 shall be reimbursed for expenses incurred in the 22 performance of their official duties in the manner and amounts provided by law for state employees. Members who 23 24 are government employees or public officials shall be

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considered on official business of their agency when 1 2 performing duties as members of the commission. 3 4 9-2-1212. Board; duties and responsibilities. 5 The Wyoming senior services board shall: 6 (a) 7 (i) Review innovative program grants and grant 8 9 proposals; 10 (ii) Approve criteria for grant categories and 11 12 grant applications through rules and regulations promulgated by the division on aging to meet the following 13 public purposes: 14 15 16 (A) То meet the demands of Wyoming's 17 growing elderly population; 18 19 (B) To enhance services to Wyoming's 20 senior citizens; 21 (C) To strengthen the opportunity for 22 senior citizens to age in the least restrictive environment 23 possible; 24

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1 2 (D) To be cost effective in the provision 3 of services to senior citizens; 4 5 (E) To promote compliance with federal and state mandates requiring placement of people in the least 6 7 restrictive environment; and 8 9 (F) To supplement and enhance existing programs providing services to senior citizens in the 10 11 state. 12 13 (iii) Review and monitor the expenditure of monies from the trust fund to grantees; and 14 15 16 (iv) Consider other necessary matters. 17 (b) In fulfilling its duties under subsection (a) of 18 this section, the board shall: 19 20 21 (i) Consult with the division on aging and the 22 advisory council on aging appointed pursuant to W.S. 9-2-1206, as necessary; 23 24

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1 (ii) Accept federal grants and other 2 contributions, grants, gifts, bequests and donations from 3 any source. 4 5 9-2-1213. Division on aging; duties. 6 7 (a) The division on aging shall: 8 9 (i) Maintain, manage and be responsible for the 10 distribution of the funds in the separate account within 11 the trust and agency fund established under W.S. 12 9-2-1210(b); 13 (ii) In consultation with the board, promulgate 14 reasonable rules and regulations in accordance with the 15 Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act to implement the 16 provisions of W.S. 9-2-1210 through 9-2-1215; 17 18 19 (iii) Disburse the funds in the separate account 20 within the trust and agency fund established under W.S. 9-2-1210(b) in accordance with awards made by the board 21 22 pursuant to W.S. 9-2-1214. 23

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19-2-1214. Disbursement of grants from trust fund2investment earnings.

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4 (a) From the funds available for distribution under
5 W.S. 9-2-1210(b), the board may award grants to senior
6 centers throughout the state to support the purposes
7 specified in W.S. 9-2-1212(a)(ii). The division on aging
8 shall disburse the funds in accordance with awards made by
9 the board under this section.

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11 (b) The board shall have the discretion in 12 determining the amount of money under each grant as 13 follows:

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15 (i) Eighty-five percent (85%) of the funds 16 available for distribution to senior centers on a formula 17 established by the division on aging in accordance with 18 subsection (c) of this section;

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(ii) Fifteen percent (15%) of the funds available shall be retained by the division on aging as a contingency fund and distributed to senior centers as determined by the board to meet emergencies or for approved projects. Notwithstanding W.S. 9-4-207, unobligated or

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1 unencumbered funds retained by the division on aging under this paragraph shall not lapse at the end of a fiscal 2 3 period and shall remain available for distribution as 4 provided in this paragraph. 5 (c) The division on aging, in consultation with the 6 board, shall by rule and regulation establish a formula for 7 distribution of funds under paragraph (b)(i) of this 8 9 section, as follows: 10 11 (i) Each eligible senior center in the state may receive a basic grant not to exceed five thousand dollars 12 13 (\$5,000.00) from the funds available for distribution; 14 15 (ii) Of the amounts remaining after the basic grants are awarded, the board shall award grants to 16 17 eligible senior centers based on the formula developed by the division on aging and approved by the board. 18 19 20 9-2-1215. Biennial audit; report by board. 21 22 The director of the department of audit or his designee 23 shall audit the trust fund created by W.S. 9-2-1210 24 biennially. The initial audit shall occur not later than 9

June 30, 2004. A report on the audit shall be provided to 1 2 the division on aging, the board, the governor and the joint labor, health and social services interim committee 3 4 no later than September 1 of the year in which the audit 5 occurs. 6 Section 2. Definitions. 9 10 11 (a) As used in this act: 12 13 (i) "Board" means the Wyoming senior services 14 board created by W.S. 9-2-1211; 15 16 (ii) "Division on aging" means the division 17 within the Wyoming department of health designated pursuant 18 to W.S. 9-2-1302(a)(iv); 19 20 (iii) "Fund" or "trust fund" means the Wyoming 21 older Americans' trust fund established by W.S. 9-2-1210; 22 (iv) "Senior center" means an organization that 23 24 receives funds under the federal administration on aging

2	nutrition program, excluding organizations that only

18	(\$5,000,000.00) from the budget reserve account to the
