A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to relations between the joint business
- 2 council of the Eastern Shoshone and Northern Arapahoe
- 3 Indian Tribes and the state of Wyoming; authorizing the

- 5 boards and to serve as sponsors for water development
- 6 projects in the same manner as local governments; providing
- 7 a statement of purpose; providing for a study; and
- 8 providing for effective dates.

2 (a) As used in this act:

4 (i) "Agencies" means Wyoming counties, municipal corporations, school districts, community college districts, the joint business council of the Eastern Shoshone and Northern Arapahoe Indian tribes, joint powers boards formed pursuant to this act or special districts specifically involved in providing facilities or functions enumerated in W.S. 16-1-104(c);

12 **16-1-104**. Joint powers, functions and facilities;
13 city-county airport board; eligible senior citizen centers.

15 (a) Any power, privilege or authority exercised or capable of being exercised by an agency may be exercised 16 17 and enjoyed jointly with any other agency having a similar power, privilege or authority. No cost shall be incurred, 18 debt accrued, nor money expended by any contracting party, 19 20 which will be in excess of limits prescribed by law. If the 21 joint business council of the Eastern Shoshone and Northern 22 Arapahoe Indian tribes participates in a joint powers board 23 under this act with political subdivisions and special districts of Wyoming, the powers of the joint business 24

2 districts are neither increased or decreased by that

3 participation. Rather the participation of the joint

11 (a) The commission shall, on the basis of the state water plan or as otherwise directed by the legislature and 12 13 after consultation with and advice from state agencies and 14 officials, other appropriate agencies and officials, the joint business council of the Eastern Shoshone and Northern 15 16 Arapahoe Indian tribes and members of the public, identify 17 and select potential projects to be studied for inclusion in the Wyoming water development program pursuant to the 18

21 (iv) Level III construction and operation plans 22 shall proceed as authorized and approved by the legislature 23 under the immediate direction and control of the 24 commission. Preference in the marketing of hydroelectric

(a) The joint tribal business council of the Eastern 6 7 Shoshone and Northern Arapahoe Indian tribes may apply to the Wyoming state engineer for a grant or grants totaling 8 9 not more than one million three hundred thousand dollars 10 (\$1,300,000.00) for rehabilitation or expansion of existing 11 water delivery systems or for water storage projects within 12 the Wind River Indian Reservation as defined, budgeted and 13 prioritized by the tribes in consultation with the state 14 engineer. The state engineer shall review any proposal submitted and shall grant the amount necessary to complete 15 16 the proposal to the joint tribal business council when each 17 proposed project is initiated, provided that the state engineer shall determine that the requirements of this 18 19 section have been met by the joint tribal business council.

The state of Wyoming recognizes that members of 6 the Eastern Shoshone and Northern Arapahoe Indian tribes 7 are citizens both of the tribal government and of Wyoming, 8 9 as well as several of its political subdivisions. Those 10 citizens can best be served if the joint business council, 11 the state of Wyoming, and the state's political subdivisions work cooperatively at every possible 12

(b) Not later than October 1, 2003, the tribal 15 16 relations select committee shall report its findings 17 regarding the success of water development pursuant to this act and recommendations for future water development and 18 19 possible legislation to the joint judiciary interim 20 committee, the joint agriculture, public lands and water 21 resources interim committee, the governor and the joint 22 business council.

1 (a) Section 1 of this act is effective July 1, 2003.

3 (b) Except as provided in subsection (a) of this

4 section, this act is effective immediately upon completion

5 of all acts necessary for a bill to become law as provided
