Remembrance of Wyoming veterans-POW/MIA flags.

A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to flags; authorizing the continued use of
2 the POW/MIA flag at the state capitol; providing for the
3 display of the POW/MIA flag at other state government
4 offices and buildings; allowing the use of the flag for
5 other government buildings and offices; specifying
6 legislative intent; and providing for an effective date.

8 *Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:*

9

10 **Section 1.** W.S. 8-3-118 is created to read:

11

12 **8-3-118. POW/MIA flags.**

14 (a) The National League of Families POW/MIA flag,
15 recognized by the United States Congress in P.L. 101-355

1 and other federal laws, is authorized and shall continue to
2 be displayed directly beneath the national flag on state
3 capitol grounds. All state buildings and offices that fly
4 the national flag shall also fly the POW/MIA flag directly
5 beneath the national flag on any day upon which the
6 national flag is displayed.

7

8 (b) Any county, city, town or political subdivision
9 of the state may display the POW/MIA flag directly beneath
10 the national flag on any day upon which the national flag
11 is displayed.

12

13 (c) All protocols used in displaying national flags
14 shall be used in displaying the POW/MIA flag. All
15 penalties provided by the laws of this state for the misuse
16 of the national flag are applicable to the POW/MIA flag.

17

18 (d) Nothing in this section shall be construed to
19 require the acquisition, erection and maintenance of a
20 flagpole or the display of the POW/MIA flag where a pole or
21 display of the national flag does not already exist.

22

23 **Section 2.** The intent of this act is to remember all
24 Wyomingites who have been or who may be listed as prisoners

1 of war or missing in action as well as to express the
2 state's concern and commitment to these individuals and
3 their families. The display of the POW/MIA flag shall
4 serve as a daily reminder of the state's concern and
5 commitment to help resolve the fates of these persons.

6

7 **Section 3.** This act is effective July 1, 2003.
