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- 8 **Section 1.** W.S. 7-19-201(a) and (b) is amended to

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- 7-19-201. State or national criminal history record
- 12 information.

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- 14 (a) State institution, department of family services
- 15 or department of health employees who may have access to
- 16 minors, to persons suffering mental illness or

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1 developmental disabilities or to the elderly shall be

2 required to submit to fingerprinting for the purpose of

3 obtaining state or and national criminal history record

4 information before employment or transfer to a position

5 where access is acquired. On and after July 1, 1996,

6 applicants for initial certification by the professional

7 teaching standards board and employees initially hired by a

8 school district on or after July 1, 1996, who may have

9 access to minors in the course of their employment shall be

10 required to submit to fingerprinting for the same purposes.

11 For purposes of this article, department of health or

12 department of family services contractors providing

13 specialized home care or respite care to minors shall be

14 considered departmental employees.

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16 (b) Fingerprints taken pursuant to this article shall

17 be submitted to the Wyoming division of criminal

18 investigation for processing and obtaining state or and

19 national criminal history record information and shall be

20 accompanied by the fee required by W.S. 7-19-108. Upon

21 payment of required fees, the division shall process and

22 obtain state and national criminal history record

23 information for the Wyoming state board of nursing or for

24 an applicant for licensure or certification by the board.

Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2003.
