Payroll check-off amendments.

A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to state employee compensation; specifying
2 purposes for which direct deductions from payroll payments
3 may be made under payroll check-off programs; amending fees
4 that may be assessed as specified; and providing for an
5 effective date.

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7 *Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:*

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9 **Section 1.** W.S. 9-3-101(e) is amended to read:

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11 **9-3-101. Salaries; amount; date of payment.**

13 (e) The state auditor and payroll officers for
14 employees of the ~~department of transportation, the~~
15 University of Wyoming and community colleges may establish
16 payroll check-off programs for state employees under which
17 payments to third-parties are made directly from deductions

1 from state employee payroll payments for supplemental
2 medical plans, disability plans, life insurance plans, and
3 annuities, employee organizations and nonprofit charitable
4 organizations. The state auditor and other payroll officers
5 authorized to establish a payroll check-off program may
6 impose an initial fee of up to ~~one thousand five hundred~~
7 ~~dollars (\$1,500.00)~~ five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for each
8 deduction filed upon a third-party for which check-off
9 payments are established and thereafter, may impose an
10 annual fee of ~~two dollars (\$2.00)~~ one dollar (\$1.00) per
11 enrolled employee. State initiated programs, employee
12 associations and nonprofit charitable organizations shall
13 be exempt from the annual fee. The state auditor and other
14 payroll officers authorized to establish a payroll check-
15 off program may establish rules and regulations to
16 implement the program.

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18 **Section 2.** This act is effective July 1, 2003.
