A BILL

for

1 ACT relating to wildlife; providing for the 2 reclassification, harvesting and other regulation of gray 3 wolves as trophy game animals as specified; providing for 4 the regulation of wolf hybrids; providing a definition of 5 livestock for purposes of the game and fish provisions; 6 providing for meetings and for rulemaking; prohibiting the 7 capture of specified wildlife; providing a statement of legislative intent; providing for implementation and 8 reports; making conforming amendments; and providing for an 9 10 effective date.

12 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

14 **Section 1.** W.S. 23-1-108 and 23-1-304 are created to

6 Gray wolves shall be deemed removed from the list of

7 experimental nonessential population, endangered species or

8 threatened species in Wyoming upon final publication in the

9 Federal Register by appropriate federal agencies removing

10 the gray wolf from all listings as an experimental

11 nonessential population, endangered species or threatened

12 species in Wyoming.

23-1-304. Classification of gray wolves.

16 (a) The commission shall determine the classification

17 of gray wolves as provided in this section. In making this

18 classification the commission shall rely upon information

19 provided by department personnel and shall consult with the

20 Wyoming animal damage management board created by W.S.

21 11-6-303 and the director of the Wyoming department of

22 agriculture, and consider any additional information

23 provided by that board and by that director.

1 (b) The department shall provide to the commission at

2 least a quarterly monitoring report on the number of gray

3 wolf packs within this state and their general location.

4 Within thirty (30) days of receiving a department report

5 the commission shall at a public meeting:

6

7 (i) Determine if there are less than seven (7)

8 packs of gray wolves located in this state and primarily

9 outside of Yellowstone National Park, Grand Teton National

10 Park and John D. Rockefeller, Jr. Memorial Parkway. If

11 such a determination is made:

12

13 (A) The commission shall adopt rules and

14 regulations to classify the gray wolf as a trophy game

15 animal and prohibit the taking of gray wolves except as

16 provided by W.S. 23-3-115(c), within that area of the state

17 the commission determines is necessary to reasonably ensure

18 seven (7) packs of gray wolves are located in this state

19 and primarily outside of Yellowstone National Park, Grand

20 Teton National Park and John D. Rockefeller, Jr. Memorial

21 Parkway at the end of the current calendar year;

22

23 (B) At any time that gray wolves are

24 classified as trophy game animals outside of any area

1 specified in W.S. 23-1-101(a)(xii)(B)(I), the commission

2 shall:

4 (I) Meet in public not less than once

5 every ninety (90) days to review the classification and

6 determine the need for its continuance;

7

8 (II) At the request of the director of

9 the Wyoming department of agriculture, consider the

10 reclassification of wolves in all or a portion of such area

11 at the commission's next scheduled meeting, but not later

12 than sixty (60) days from receipt of the request.

13

14 (ii) Maintain the classification of gray wolves

15 as a predatory animal and trophy game animal as specified

16 in W.S. 23-1-101(a) (viii) and (xii) (B) (I), if it determines

17 there were seven (7) packs of gray wolves located in this

18 state and primarily outside of Yellowstone National Park,

19 Grand Teton National Park and John D. Rockefeller, Jr.

20 Memorial Parkway as of the end of the preceding calendar

21 quarter.

22

23 (c) For purposes of this section "pack" means five

24 (5) or more gray wolves traveling together. If a group of

1 gray wolves consists of more than ten (10) animals known to

2 be traveling together, the commission may, at its

3 discretion, recognize the number of packs within such a

4 group to be equal to the number of reproductively mature

5 females bearing young found within that group of wolves.

6

7 (d) The department shall institute and maintain an 8 active program of population monitoring statewide. In all

9 areas of the state, except where otherwise provided, any

10 person who harvests a wolf shall notify the department

11 where the harvest occurred within ten (10) days. Any

12 information regarding the number or nature of wolves

13 legally harvested within the state of Wyoming shall only be

14 released in its aggregate form and no information of a

15 private or confidential nature shall be released without

16 the written consent of the person to whom the information

17 may refer. Information identifying any person legally

18 harvesting a wolf within this state is solely for the use

19 of the department or appropriate law enforcement offices

20 and is not a public record for purposes of W.S. 16-4-201

21 through 16-4-205.

23 (e) This section shall apply from and after the date

23-1-103. Ownership of wildlife; purpose 1 of 2 provisions. 3 4 For the purpose of this act, all wildlife in Wyoming is the 5 property of the state. It is the purpose of this act and the policy of the state to provide an adequate and flexible 6 7 system for control, propagation, management, protection and regulation of all Wyoming wildlife. There shall be no 8 9 private ownership of live animals classified in this act as 10 big or trophy game animals or of any wolf or wolf hybrid. 11 12 23-1-302. Powers and duties. 13 14 The commission is directed and empowered: (a) 15 16 (xxix) After the date gray wolves are removed 17 from the list of experimental nonessential population, 18 endangered species or threatened species in Wyoming as 19 provided by W.S. 23-1-108, to classify gray wolves as 20 predatory or trophy game animals in accordance with W.S. 21 23-1-304, and to regulate the number of gray wolves which

21	(e) When hunting antelope, bighorn sheep, black bear,
22	deer, mountain goat or mountain lion the longbow hunter
23	must be equipped with a longbow of not less than forty (40)
24	pounds draw weight or possessing the ability to cast a

1 hunting arrow of four hundred (400) grain weight at least 2 one hundred sixty (160) yards. When hunting elk, grizzly 3 bear or moose, the longbow hunter must be equipped with a 4 longbow of not less than fifty (50) pounds draw weight or 5 possessing the ability to cast a hunting arrow of five hundred (500) grain weight at least one hundred sixty (160) 6 7 yards. The crossbow hunter must be equipped with a crossbow of not less than ninety (90) pounds draw weight which has a 8 9 minimum draw length of fourteen (14) inches (from front of 10 bow to back of string in the cocked position), a positive 11 safety mechanism, and, except as provided in subsection (f) 12 of this section, which must be cocked by hand without the 13 aid of leverage-gaining devices. Crossbow bolts must be at 14 least sixteen (16) inches long. The broadhead of arrows or 15 bolts shall be of sharp steel with a minimum cutting width 16 The provisions of this subsection of one (1) inch. 17 relating to the hunting of antelope, bighorn sheep, black 18 bear, deer, mountain goat and mountain lion shall also 19 apply to the hunting of the gray wolf as a trophy game 20 animal from and after the date gray wolves are removed from 21 the list of experimental nonessential population, 22 endangered species or threatened species in Wyoming as 23 provided by W.S. 23-1-108.

1 23-2-303. Trapping licenses; tagging; traps and

2 snares; penalty; confiscation.

3

4 (d) All traps and snares used for furbearing or 5 predatory animals shall be permanently marked or tagged with the address of 6 name and the owner or the identification number assigned to the 7 owner by the department. Any identification number attached to a trap or 8 9 snare pursuant to this subsection is solely for the use of 10 the department or appropriate law enforcement officers and 11 is not a public record for purposes of W.S. 16-4-201 12 through 16-4-205. No trap or snare shall be set for 13 furbearing or predatory animals within thirty (30) feet of 14 any exposed bait or carcass over five (5) pounds in weight. As used in this subsection, "exposed bait or carcass" means 15 16 the meat or viscera of any part of a mammal, bird or fish, excluding dried bones. In addition, all snares used for 17 taking furbearing or predatory animals shall be equipped 18 with a break-away locking device that is designed to 19 20 release at two hundred ninety-five (295) pounds of pressure 21 or less and a snare loop not to exceed twelve (12) inches 22 in diameter measured side to side. Unless otherwise 23 specified in this section, all traps, excluding snares set 24 for furbearing animals and predatory animals and quick kill

1 body grip traps as defined by commission rule and 2 regulation, shall be checked by the owner at least once 3 during each seventy-two (72) hour period from the time the 4 traps were set. Quick kill body grip traps shall be checked 5 by the owner not less than once each seven (7) day period from the time the traps were set. All wildlife caught in 6 7 any trap or snare shall upon discovery, be removed immediately by the owner. Violation of this subsection 8 9 constitutes a ninth degree misdemeanor. After the date gray 10 wolves are removed from the list of experimental 11 nonessential population, endangered species or threatened 12 species in Wyoming as provided by W.S. 23-1-108 the 13 commission may enact rules and regulations setting forth 14 the specifications for traps and snares used for the taking 15 of gray wolves and the time period for checking such traps 16 and snares. Except as otherwise provided by commission 17 rule, the provisions in this section regulating the 18 trapping of furbearing and predatory animals shall apply to 19 the trapping of gray wolves.

21 23-3-102. Taking certain game animals without license 22 or during a closed season prohibited.

1 (b) Any person who takes any bighorn sheep, mountain
2 goat, mountain lion, or grizzly bear or, if licensed
3 hunting of wolves is authorized, gray wolf, without the
4 proper license except as otherwise permitted by this act is
5 guilty of a 4th degree misdemeanor.

7 23-3-115. Taking black bear, mountain lion, gray
8 wolf, bobcat, weasel, badger, squirrels or muskrat for
9 damaging property.

(c) The provisions of subsection (a) of this section 11 relating to the taking of animals doing damage to private 12 property shall apply to gray wolves from and after the date 13 14 gray wolves are removed from the list of experimental 15 nonessential population, endangered species or threatened species in Wyoming as provided by W.S. 23-1-108. The owner, 16 17 employee or lessee acting under authority of this section shall notify the department of the killing of a gray wolf 18 19 within an area of the state in which the gray wolf is 20 classified as a trophy game animal. The notification shall 21 be made within ten (10) days of the kill unless the gray 22 wolf was taken in an area where wolves have been classified 23 as trophy game animals pursuant to W.S. 23-1-304(b)(i)(A)

1 in which case the notification shall be made within 2 seventy-two (72) hours. 3 4 23-3-301. Importation and sale of wildlife 5 prohibited; exceptions. 6 7 (a) No person shall capture or import into Wyoming from any source any living antelope, bear, deer, elk, 8 9 moose, mountain goat, mountain lion, bighorn sheep, wolf, 10 wolf hybrid nor any living wildlife except as otherwise 11 permitted by this act. 12 13 (b) No person shall capture or sell any living 14 antelope, bear, deer, elk, moose, mountain goat, mountain lion, bighorn sheep, wolf, wolf hybrid or falcon except as 15 16 permitted by the commission. 17 18 23-3-304. Certain trapping devices unlawful; game for 19 bait prohibited; baiting big game animals prohibited; 20 penalties. 21 22 (a) No person shall take or wound any game animal, 23 game bird, or game fish by use of any pit, pitfall, net,

trap, deadfall, poison, or other similar device except as

8 **Section 3.** Nothing in this act shall prohibit the

9 ownership of a wolf hybrid if the animal was owned before

10 the effective date of this act by a person then residing in

11 this state.

- 15 (a) It is the purpose of this act, unless the
- 16 introduction of the gray wolf into Wyoming is determined by
- 17 lawful authorities not to have been in accordance with
- 18 federal law, to provide appropriate state management and
- 19 control of gray wolves in order to facilitate the removal
- 20 of the gray wolf from its listing as an experimental
- 21 nonessential population, endangered species or threatened
- 22 species in Wyoming and to prevent future listing of the
- 23 gray wolf as an experimental nonessential population,
- 24 endangered species or threatened species.

1

2 In order to accomplish the purposes of this act, (b) 3 the game and fish commission shall enter into a memorandum 4 of understanding with appropriate federal agencies under 5 which the commission and federal agencies shall endeavor to manage the prey base for gray wolves in a manner to 6 maintain a sufficient prey base in Yellowstone National 7 Park, Grand Teton National Park and John D. Rockefeller, 8 9 Jr. Memorial Parkway within the state for at least eight 10 (8) packs of wolves. The game and fish commission shall 11 endeavor to manage big game populations providing a prey 12 base for seven (7) packs of gray wolves in all other areas 13 of the state in such a manner as to mitigate to the 14 greatest extent possible, adverse effects on opportunities for licensed hunters to take big game. 15

16

17 (c) The game and fish commission shall report to the 18 joint travel, recreation, wildlife and cultural resources 19 interim committee not later than September 1, 2003, 20 regarding the implementation of this act.

1 **Section 5.** This act is effective immediately upon

2 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

3 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

4 Constitution.
