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6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 8 **Section 1.** W.S. 7-19-201(a) and 14-4-104 by creating
- 9 a new subsection (f) are amended to read:

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- 7-19-201. State or national criminal history record
- 12 information.

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- 14 (a) State institution, department of family services
- 15 or department of health employees who may have access to
- 16 minors, to persons suffering mental illness or

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developmental disabilities or to the elderly shall be 1 2 required to submit to fingerprinting for the purpose of 3 obtaining state or national criminal history record 4 information before employment or transfer to a position 5 where access is acquired. On and after July 1, 1996, applicants for initial certification by the professional 6 7 teaching standards board and employees initially hired by a school district on or after July 1, 1996, who may have 8 9 access to minors in the course of their employment shall be 10 required to submit to fingerprinting for the same purposes. For purposes of this article, department of health or 11 12 family services contractors providing department of 13 specialized home care or respite care to minors shall be 14 considered departmental employees. On and after July 1, 15 2003, all prospective employees of child care facilities 16 certified by the department of family services shall submit 17 an application and fingerprints through the department of family services for the purpose of obtaining state or 18 19 national criminal history record information before 20 employment at a certified child care facility.

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(f) Every child care facility certified under this 1 2 section shall submit the name, fingerprints and other 3 identifying information necessary for the department to 4 conduct a state and national criminal history record 5 information check on each prospective employee of the facility who may have access to children. The department 6 7 shall notify the facility if a prospective employee has a state or national criminal history record which would 8 9 warrant the employer to investigate further to ensure 10 compliance with paragraph (b)(i) of this section. 11 Section 2. This act is effective immediately upon

12 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 13 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the 14 15 Constitution.
