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13	(a) The following sales or leases are exempt from the
14	excise tax imposed by this article:
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1 (vi) For the purpose of exempting sales of 2 services and tangible personal property which are essential 3 human goods and services, the following are exempt: 4 5 (B) Sales of prescription drugs for human relief, insulin for human relief and any syringe, needle or 6 other device necessary for the administration thereof, 7 oxygen and oxygen concentrators for medical use, blood 8 9 plasma, prosthetic devices, hearing aids, crutches, 10 wheelchairs, eyeglasses, and contact lenses and any 11 assistive device. As used in this subparagraph, "assistive 12 device" means any item, piece of equipment or product 13 system which is used to increase, maintain or improve the 14 functional capabilities of an individual with a permanent disability, excluding any medical device, surgical device 15 16 or organ implanted or transplanted into or attached 17 directly to an individual; 18 19 39-16-105. Exemptions.

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(a) The following purchases or leases are exempt fromthe excise tax imposed by this article:

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1 (vi) For the purpose of exempting sales of 2 services and tangible personal property and services which 3 are essential human goods and services, the following are 4 exempt:

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(A) Purchases of prescription drugs for 6 human relief, insulin for human relief and any syringe, 7 needle or other device necessary for the administration 8 9 thereof, oxygen and oxygen concentrators for medical use, 10 blood plasma, prosthetic devices, hearing aids, crutches, 11 wheelchairs, eyeglasses, and contact lenses and any 12 assistive device. As used in this subparagraph, "assistive 13 device" means any item, piece of equipment or product 14 system which is used to increase, maintain or improve the 15 functional capabilities of an individual with a permanent disability, excluding any medical device, surgical device 16 17 or organ implanted or transplanted into or attached 18 directly to an individual;
