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1 2 (a) As used in this article: 3 4 (i) "Department" means the department of 5 revenue; 6 (ii) "Program" means an alcohol server training 7 program and examination administered to servers by 8 9 providers under the provisions of this article; 10 11 (iii) "Provider" means an individual, partnership, corporation, public or private school or any 12 13 other legal entity certified by the department to provide an alcohol server training program authorized by this 14 15 article; 16 17 (iv) "Server" means a person who physically serves or delivers alcoholic liquor at retail on or off the 18 premises of a business licensed by a local licensing 19 20 authority under this title. 21 22 12-2-402. Powers and duties of the department. 23

1 (a) Not later than December 31, 2003, the department 2 shall promulgate rules establishing an alcohol server 3 training program to train servers to help promote safe and 4 responsible consumption of alcoholic liquor.

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6 (b) The rules shall provide for the certification of 7 providers who shall use curricula developed by the 8 department. Providers may be independent contractors, 9 private persons, or private or public schools. The 10 department shall promulgate rules governing the manner in 11 which providers make available program courses and 12 examinations to servers.

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14 (c) The department may suspend, revoke or not renew 15 any certification issued to a provider if, after notice and 16 opportunity for a hearing, the department finds the 17 provider has violated this article or any rule promulgated 18 under this article.

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Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2003.
