- 1 AN ACT relating to public lands; providing for a process to
- 2 maintain public access to state and federal lands after
- 3 transfers of ownership interests in lands providing access;
- 4 requiring public access as a condition of any grazing or
- 5 agriculture lease; and providing for an effective date.

7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

9 **Section 1.** W.S. 36-1-120 is created to read:

10

36-1-120. Access to public lands to be maintained.

- 13 (a) If the sale or other transfer of ownership of
- 14 land within this state has the effect of denying public
- 15 access to state or federal land and the requirements of
- 16 this section are met, the board shall take action in

1 accordance with this section to maintain public access to

2 those state or federal lands.

3

4 (b) A petition requesting board action pursuant to

5 this section shall be presented to the board. The petition

6 shall:

7

8 (i) Be signed by not less than one hundred (100)

9 qualified electors;

10

11 (ii) Provide a legal description of the land

12 transferred;

13

14 (iii) Specify the date of the transfer, which

15 shall be on or after July 1, 2003;

16

17 (iv) Specify the buyer and seller of the lands

18 transferred; and

19

20 (v) Describe the access to the state or federal

21 lands provided to the public over the transferred lands

22 prior to the transfer and the access available to the

23 public after the transfer:

1 (A) Over the transferred lands; and

2

3 (B) Over other lands, with a description of 4 the nearest public access point to the state or federal

5 lands, measured from the prior access point of the

6 transferred lands.

7

8 (c) Upon receipt of a petition meeting the 9 requirements of this section, the board shall direct the 10 director of the office of state lands to investigate the 11 transfer and to report to the board on the availability of public access to the state or federal lands which are the 12 13 subject of the petition. Upon receipt of the director's 14 report, the board may conduct such hearings as the board deems appropriate. If the board determines that public 15 16 access over the transferred lands was generally available prior to the transfer, that such access is no longer 17 available over the land in question and that no other 18 reasonable public access is available over other lands 19 20 within ten (10) miles of the prior public access point, the 21 board shall attempt to acquire a public easement over the 22 transferred lands by purchase. If, after a good faith effort, the board cannot purchase an easement it shall 23 24 determine whether the easement should be procured under the

1 Wyoming Eminent Domain Act and if so, shall proceed in

2 accordance with that act. Providing public access to state

3 or federal lands in accordance with this section shall be

4 considered an appropriate project under the Wyoming Eminent

5 Domain Act. If the board finds that any requirement of

6 this section is not met, it may dismiss the petition with

7 or without a hearing.

8

9 (d) For purposes of this section:

10

11 (i) "Buyer" means the person buying or otherwise

12 acquiring ownership rights in property;

13

14 (ii) "Qualified elector" means a natural person

15 whose name appears on the current registry list of the

16 county clerk of the county in which the transferred land is

17 located;

18

19 (iii) "Seller" means the person selling or

20 otherwise relinquishing ownership rights in property.

22 **Section 2.** W.S. 36-5-102 is amended to read:

36-5-102. Maximum term of agricultural or grazing

1

2 lease; lease to require public access. 3 4 (a) No lease for agricultural or grazing purposes 5 shall be issued for a term of more than ten (10) years. 6 7 (b) On and after July 1, 2003, no lease for 8 agricultural or grazing purposes shall be issued or renewed 9 unless the lessee agrees as a condition of the lease to 10 provide an easement from a public road to the leased lands 11 to allow public access for hunting, fishing and recreation. 12 The public access requirement of this subsection shall 13 apply only if there is no other reasonable public access to 14 the leased lands and the lessee owns or controls land over which access from a public road to the leased land is 15 available. The public access provided shall be approved by 16 17 the board. 18 19 Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2003. 20 21 (END)
