ENROLLED ACT NO. 1, HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

FIFTY-SEVENTH LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WYOMING 2004 SPECIAL SESSION

AN ACT relating to the University of Wyoming and medical education programs; providing an appropriation for additional student participation as specified; requiring studies and a report; and providing for an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

Section 1. There is appropriated from the general fund to the University of Wyoming three thousand three hundred dollars (\$3,300.00) to fund up to an additional six (6) first-year medical students in the WWAMI medical education program at the University of Washington for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2005, thereby increasing class size from ten (10) to at least twelve (12) and up to sixteen (16) students. The University of Wyoming shall include in its budget request for the 2007-2008 biennium sufficient funding to sustain the size of each class at not less than twelve (12) and not more than sixteen (16) students. The goal is by the fall enrollment of 2007 the first year class shall have a capacity of sixteen (16) students.

Section 2.

- (a) The University of Wyoming shall:
- (i) Explore the potential of expanding the WWAMI medical education program to a total of twenty (20) students per class;
- (ii) Explore the potential of expanding or subsidizing to a larger degree than current practice the family practice residency programs in the state, including alternative funding sources for those programs;

- (iii) Explore the potential for alternative scholarship programs for medical students from this state;
- (iv) Report to the joint appropriations interim committee not later than December 1, 2004, results of its studies under this section, including the cost of potential changes, the number of students affected and the number of students likely to practice medicine in Wyoming as a licensed physician as a result of each specifically identified modification to a program.

Section 3. This act is effective immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming Constitution.
