A BILL

for

1 A JOINT RESOLUTION proposing to amend the Wyoming 2 Constitution to allow the state and its political 3 subdivisions to lend or give credit or make donations to 4 assist in the provision of health care.

6 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WYOMING, 7 two-thirds of all the members of the two houses, voting 8 separately, concurring therein:

10 Section 1. The following proposal to amend Wyoming 11 Constitution, Article 16, Section 6 is proposed for 12 submission to the electors of the State of Wyoming at the 13 next general election for approval or rejection to become 14 valid as a part of the Constitution if ratified by a 15 majority of the electors at the election:

Article 16, Section 6. Loan of credit; donations
 prohibited; works of internal improvement.

Neither the state nor any county, city, township, town, 4 5 school district, or any other political subdivision, shall 6 loan or give its credit or make donations to or in aid of 7 any individual, association or corporation, except for 8 necessary support of the poor or to support the provision 9 of health care, nor subscribe to or become the owner of the capital stock of any association or corporation, except 10 that funds of public employee retirement systems and the 11 12 permanent funds of the state of Wyoming may be invested in 13 such stock under conditions the legislature prescribes. 14 The state shall not engage in any work of internal improvement unless authorized by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of 15 16 the people.
