A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to health care providers; providing that
- 2 certain statements of health care providers or their
- 3 employees are inadmissible in civil actions or arbitration,
- 4 as specified; providing definitions; and providing for an
- 5 effective date.

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7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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9 **Section 1.** W.S. 1-1-130 is created to read:

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- 11 1-1-130. Actions against health care providers;
- 12 admissibility of evidence.

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- 14 (a) In any civil action or arbitration brought by an
- 15 alleged victim of an unanticipated outcome of medical care
- 16 against a health care provider, any and all statements,

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1 affirmations, gestures or conduct expressing apology,

2 sympathy, commiseration, condolence, compassion or a

3 general sense of benevolence that are made by a health care

4 provider or an employee of a health care provider to the

5 alleged victim, or to a relative or representative of the

6 alleged victim, and that relate to the discomfort, pain,

7 suffering, injury or death of the alleged victim as the

8 result of the unanticipated outcome of medical care, are

9 inadmissible as evidence of an admission of liability or as

10 evidence of an admission against interest.

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12 (b) For purposes of this section:

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14 (i) "Health care provider" means as defined in

15 W.S. 26-40-102 (a) (i);

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17 (ii) "Relative" means a spouse, parent,

18 grandparent, stepfather, stepmother, child, grandchild,

19 brother, sister, half brother, half sister or parent of a

20 spouse, and includes those relationships established by

21 adoption;

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23 (iii) "Representative" means a legal guardian,

24 attorney, person designated to make decisions on behalf of

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a patient under a medical power of attorney or any person 1 2 recognized in law or custom as a patient's agent; 3 4 (iv) "Unanticipated outcome" means the result of 5 a medical treatment or procedure that differs from an 6 expected result. 7

Section 2. This act is effective immediately upon 8 9 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 10 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming Constitution. 11
